“Third Red Scare”

The **Red Scare** refers to periods in U.S. history when widespread fear of **communism, socialism, or revolutionary left-wing movements** led to heightened public concern, government investigations, and, in some cases, restrictions on civil liberties. The United States experienced two major Red Scares.

First Red Scare (1919–1920)

The First Red Scare followed **World War I** and the **1917 Russian Revolution**, when the Bolsheviks established the Soviet state. Many Americans feared that communist revolution might spread to the United States.

Contributing factors included:

- Labor strikes across major industries.
- A series of anarchist bombings.
- Political unrest in Europe.
- Concerns about immigrant radicalism.

The federal government responded with the **Palmer Raids**, led by Attorney General A. Mitchell Palmer. Thousands of suspected radicals were arrested, and many immigrants were detained or deported.

Second Red Scare (Late 1940s–1950s)

The Second Red Scare occurred during the early **Cold War** between the United States and the Soviet Union. This period was influenced by genuine espionage concerns as well as widespread public fear.

Factors contributing to the Second Red Scare included:

- Soviet expansion in Eastern Europe.
- The Soviet Union's successful atomic bomb test in 1949.
- The Chinese Communist Revolution.
- The Korean War.
- Confirmed espionage cases involving individuals who passed information to the Soviet Union.

Government responses included:

- Loyalty programs for federal employees.
- Congressional investigations into alleged communist influence.
- Security clearances and background investigations.
- Criminal prosecutions under certain federal statutes.

McCarthyism

The term **McCarthyism** comes from Senator Joseph McCarthy, who claimed that communists had infiltrated the U.S. government. While Soviet espionage did occur during the Cold War, many of McCarthy's public accusations were unsupported or not substantiated with sufficient evidence. As a result, numerous individuals experienced damaged reputations, loss of employment, and blacklisting without proof of wrongdoing.

US:

Today, anarchists and anti-state activists have adopted tactics that may be considered as extreme as, if not more extreme than, those seen during previous Red Scares. They do attack veterans, our military and public servants, they attack public officials, and those within the political activism sphere. They simply target Americans. They have shown their true colors: **Red**.

Without a hint of its intention, the full force of the Federal authorities fell on radicals from coast to coast last night and, as reports came into the Government headquarters where William J. Flynn, chief of the Department of Justice Bureau of Investigation, sat, showing the drive, it was said that thousands of agitators abroad at the overthrow of the Government had been trapped in the nation's greatest cities of violence.

The blow was aimed at one organization only—the Communist Party of America. This head of followers of the Lenin-Trotsky doctrine of violent government has been conducting a campaign against American institutions and, consequently has been in close contact

Raiders Ordered to Make Cleanup Thorough; Warned Against Violence or Taking Valuables

The following instructions as to the conduct of the raids were issued in identical form to all Department of Justice men engaged in the action throughout the country:

INSTRUCTIONS

Our activities will be directed against the radical organizations known as the Communist Party of America and the Communist Labor Party of America, also known as Communists.

The strike will be made promptly and simultaneously at 8:30 P. M. in all districts. The meeting places of the Communists in your territory, and the names and addresses of the officers and heads that you are to arrest, are on the attached list.

You will also arrest all active members when found.

Particular efforts should be made to apprehend all the officers, irrespective of where they may be, and, with respect to such officers, their residences should be searched and in every instance all literature, manuscripts, records, records and correspondence are to be taken.

When a citizen is arrested as a Communist, he must be present with the officers searching his home at the time of the search.

Heating rooms should be thoroughly searched.

Locate and obtain the charter. All records, if not found in the meeting rooms, will probably be found in the home of the Recording Secretary or Financial Secretary, but in every instance, if possible records should be found and taken.

All literature, books, papers, pictures on the walls of the meeting places, should be gathered together and tagged with tags which will be supplied you, with the names and address of the person by whom obtained and where obtained.

In searching meeting places, a thorough search should be made and the walls searched.

It is no part of the Government that taking to these apartments should be scrupulously avoided.

Immediately upon the apprehension of the alien, or citizen, search him thoroughly. If found in groups in a meeting room, they should be lined up against the wall and searched. Particular efforts should be made to obtain membership cards on the persons who are taken.

Make an absolute search of the individual. No valuables, such as jewelry and money, to be taken away from those arrested.

After a search has been made of the person arrested you will take all the evidence you have obtained from his person and place in an envelope, which will be furnished you, placing the name, address, contents of the envelope, by whom taken and where, on the outside of the envelope and deliver to me with the alien.

Everybody will remain on duty until relieved, without exception.

Flashlights, arms, tags and envelopes should be carried, as per instructions.

In searching rooms of an alien pay particular attention to everything in the room and make a thorough search thereof.

You are also warned to take notice that no violence is to be used.

You will communicate with me by telephone from your several districts, the number of the telephone herewith given.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 5.—A nation-wide raid on members of the Communist Party and the Communist Labor Party was conducted tonight by agents of the Department of Justice. In thirty-four cities of the country, extending from the Pacific to the Atlantic, and near neighboring towns, Secret Service operatives, armed with thousands of weapons, set out to make wholesale arrests. According to reports reaching here the total of arrests up to a late hour had reached nearly 2,000.
