

Non-Profit Racketeering – American Indentured Servitude To NGOS – Cost

Federal Reserve data show that U.S. nonprofit organizations collectively held approximately **\$14.2 trillion in assets as of the first quarter of 2026**. This data demonstrates the enormous economic scale of the nonprofit sector and raises legitimate questions about the relationship between tax-exempt organizations, government funding, grants, contracts, and public policy. At the same time, the **U.S. national debt has surpassed \$40 trillion**, while annual federal interest costs have reached approximately **\$1.2 trillion**. These numbers highlight the growing financial burden of federal borrowing and the need for greater transparency and accountability in government spending.

Immigration is another area where the fiscal consequences warrant examination. The Congressional Budget Office (CBO) estimates that the recent immigration surge will increase federal mandatory spending and net interest by approximately **\$300 billion over 2024–2034**,

while also increasing federal revenues by approximately \$1.2 trillion. At the state and local level, CBO estimated that the immigration surge produced approximately **\$19.3 billion in additional spending and \$10.1 billion in additional revenue in 2023**, resulting in a net fiscal cost of approximately **\$9.2 billion** that year.

Americans deserve transparent accounting of how their tax dollars are collected, allocated, and spent. Regardless of political party, government officials and institutions should be held accountable for measurable outcomes, fiscal responsibility, and the protection of the constitutional interests and security of the American people.
