

The American Reality Shift

One out of three residents in Los Angeles is foreign-born. Twenty percent of Los Angeles residents are not authorized to be there. Hispanics and Black Americans are more likely to support anti-ICE protests. Hispanic and Black organized crime has also succeeded, followed, in a cold-war fashion, by Russian-Israeli organized crime. This is today's reality.

Sadly, at this level of cultural and population replacement—especially given the weight of politics, activism, and institutional involvement—it can be defined as cultural genocide and crimes against humanity, particularly where citizens and public servants are targeted.

Activism movements are now seen openly as committing genocide against the American people and American culture. When America is replaced, the replacement will not cry; they will celebrate.
