Modern China–Mexico Organized-Crime Connection

Research has found Chinese criminal networks operating in Mexico in areas including precursor chemicals, money laundering and other illicit markets. Brookings specifically describes Chinese underground banking networks as major money-laundering mechanisms for Mexican cartels and Chinese networks as important suppliers of precursor chemicals.

The Complete Modern Pipeline

Four interconnected pipelines:

1. REVOLUTIONARY PIPELINE

Marxism → RSDLP → Bolsheviks/Mensheviks → Russian Revolution → Civil War → Soviet Union → Comintern → International communism

2. COLD WAR PIPELINE

Soviet Union → Eastern Europe → NATO/Warsaw Pact → nuclear arms race → intelligence → propaganda → proxy wars

3. CHINA–MEXICO–TRANSNATIONAL CRIME PIPELINE

Chinese state/geopolitical influence **and separately** Chinese criminal networks → China–Mexico connections → precursor chemicals / underground banking → Mexican cartels → narcotics → U.S. criminal markets

4. DOMESTIC CONFLICT PIPELINE

Political radicalization → extremist organizations → gangs/organized crime → political violence → foreign influence where specifically documented → domestic instability
