## Standing Strong Against Bullies and Gangsters

Today I want to talk with you about a subject that is very important and affects people of every age. Bullying and groups that gang up on others can leave lasting emotional wounds. Every one of us has the power to make our schools, neighborhoods, workplaces, and communities kinder and safer through the choices we make each day.

You have probably heard the words **gang** or **gangster**. Have you ever wondered why those words are used? They describe people who gather together to intimidate, pressure, or overpower someone else. Bullies often behave in the same way by trying to gain confidence through numbers instead of through character, integrity, and kindness.

Here is the truth. Real strength comes from lifting people up and encouraging them to become their very best. The strength of a hero is a thousand times greater than the strength of someone who chooses intimidation or cruelty because heroes create hope, inspire courage, and change lives for the better. Every one of us has the opportunity to choose that kind of strength every single day.

Whenever you see someone being bullied, you have a choice. You may remain silent, you may join the crowd, or you may choose to stand beside the person who needs support. Standing up for another person is not always easy, yet courage often begins with one small act of kindness and one person willing to do what is right.

Courage means choosing what is right, even when the choice is difficult or unpopular. Kindness requires strength because it asks us to care for others even when it would be easier to walk away. Heroes understand that true leadership is shown through compassion, respect, and service to others.

Bullies often want people to feel afraid, isolated, or powerless. We can choose kindness instead. We can choose respect. We can choose to become the kind of friends who stand beside others with encouragement, compassion, and understanding.
