You have taken over the talking space here, brought my name into the conversation as a “donor,” and behaved as though I used that term myself. It is clear that you are still relying on logical fallacies and biases in your conversations, including racial bias, which some people refer to as racism. I have very little tolerance for it.

While I applaud your advocacy efforts, I feel that your position is clearly biased toward Black activism. I spent a long time advocating for the Black community, and I expect the same concern to be shown in cases such as this one. A woman was reportedly the victim of theft at a park while spending time with her baby. The man filming her, a rapist and pedophile—please see my paper—then coerced her into speaking on camera before publishing the footage online, where she was subjected to blackmail, doxxing, and harassment.

She was later told that she could serve time for using language that members of the Black community frequently use without receiving the same penalty. The disparity in how people are treated across racial lines is as clear as day. The data does not lie.

Please allow the floor to be shared. This conversation is not entirely about you. It is about the woman in this case and what she experienced. She lost her property, dignity, privacy, and valuable time with her family. Thankfully, members of the community came together to support her. Her case is not unique.

Just a word, folks. This is my last comment. I have already offered so much here. Those who put words in my mouth, blame-shift, act racist, or shame others will be immediately blocked. We are done with political games.

White people suffer and experience racism, bullying, degradation, suppression, and slavery. This woman happened to be targeted by an immigrant rapist with a camera. She was forcibly subjected to voyeurism, and anyone who pays attention to history and modern slavery should know that it is voyeurs like this who contribute to it.

She was forced into a prison cell after retaliating against a human rights abuse. She was a victim. All of these actions together targeted her as a White woman, yet people want to take her pain and suffering and make it entirely about themselves.

This is the hypocrisy and the lame duck in the pool of race politics from which we are suffering. We are tired of it. We are muscling through abuse, violence, killings, and modern slavery daily. The data shows us White genocide. The effects of fourth-generation warfare are everywhere. A word versus a violent, relentless anti-White movement.

We have seen enough, and we are tired. We are experiencing war fatigue. Not a fake war, but a real war. It never should have come to this, yet here we are.

Stop tagging me, Angela. I have clearly already established boundaries regarding our conversation. At this stage, I am considering your comments harassment. Lastly, it is no secret that the Black community has held supremacy within activist and civil-rights spaces, which is why White targeting has been so prevalent and White slavery has affected the majority, with 86% of victims of revenge pornography and voyeurism being White.

A White baby was just murdered while sitting with her father by two Black thugs. I bet you had nothing to say then, though, right? Does your “agency” extend only to those of your own color? I have heard enough from you. I am sick to my stomach over the violent crime within your “agency.” We are sickened by the war on White people. This is where our conversation ends.

I blocked Angela. Her position as a “DEI global strategist” represents the kind of racial politics that are responsible today for the genocide of White people and Americans in general. DEI policies raise severe concerns about demographic change, inequality, and racial targeting.

White people make up a significant share of the homeless population where I live. Acadians are also a global minority whose displacement, persecution, and cultural survival are rarely discussed. Their history and the experiences of present-day victims of slavery and exploitation deserve recognition.

I strongly oppose racial politics that divide people, excuse authoritarianism, or assign collective guilt based on ancestry. It is gross to blame entire populations and even worse to blame-shift and use collective-guilt war propaganda against them. The Democratic Party and the DSA have lost their way. How many people have been hurt by policies that treat some groups as inherently deserving and others as collectively responsible?

There is injustice everywhere. Following the George Floyd protests, no one discussed the deaths, arson, and White racial targeting that occurred. George Floyd was a convicted felon

who robbed a woman at gunpoint. Their protesters caused millions of dollars in damage. Let the truth prevail. It is fourth-generation warfare, not activism.

DEI politics and the modern Holocaust. The Holocaust was a state-organized genocide involving mass imprisonment and murder. It involved discrimination, cultural erasure, and inequality. It occurred primarily among White ethnic groups, yet Black men and women were also present within the German sphere. There are always two sides to every story.

In this case, as in many others, a camera was once again used as a weapon and a form of power to control and harm another human being. This woman will suffer indefinite and permanent harm. Although she was judged in court and lost, the public formed its own opinion.
