

Body Count, Ran Through Boys, and Boys Who Shame

Not so fast.

Before these words are passed on to the next generation, we ask our followers to pause and consider the harm, cruelty, and pain they carry. Language shapes perception, it assigns value and it builds systems of power. Language can also build systems of modern slavery.

Terms like body count and ran through do more than describe human behavior, they reduce human beings, especially women, to numbers. They turn identity into a value that can be counted, evaluated, and judged. This is the “language art” of dehumanization.

Those who use this cruel language are not outside of its influence. They participate in it and reinforce it. They are the influencers and the suppressors. They too become victims of it. This is participatory slavery of the mind and voice. These are patterns of speech that confine identity and self worth within mental cages.

When boys shame girls, and when girls are victims of these harms, or repeat them, the cycle continues. It becomes culture, and habit. It becomes slavery, but also eugenics and, sadly, genocide. **So pause.**

Ask who is harmed by these words, sisters, daughters, mothers: “The Womb of Society.” Brothers, fathers, entire communities. Ask who is diminished by them. It could be an entire race of women. Of people. Ask what is being created through repetition: *Mass extermination*.

The Union of Saints calls for solemn reflection. In reflection there is awareness, choice and power to change what is spoken and what is being accepted. We ask our followers to respond with care, to reflect, and to remember where humanity comes from. Where society is birthed: A woman’s womb, built from her freedom to explore life in body and spirit.

We ask men to refuse to measure human worth through language that diminishes it.
