- Persecution and smear campaigns are a dangerous form of abuse: The Nazis used smear campaigns as a key tactic within their larger propaganda strategy to demonize and isolate perceived enemies, primarily targeting Jews, Communists, and other political opponents. Here's how they employed smear campaigns: Smear campaigns are a form of organized defamation and propaganda used to damage the reputation of an individual or group. They often involve spreading false or misleading information, rumors, and innuendo to create a negative public image. Key elements of smear campaigns include Disinformation: The deliberate spread of false information to deceive or mislead the public. Propaganda: Information, especially of a biased or misleading nature, used to promote a particular political cause or point of view. Targeting: Focusing the campaign on specific individuals or groups to undermine their credibility and influence. Repetition: Repeating negative messages across various platforms to reinforce them in the public mind. Exploiting prejudices: Tapping into existing biases and prejudices within a population to make the smear campaign more effective. The goal of a smear campaign is to erode public trust in the target, making them less influential or effective. This can have significant consequences for individuals and society as a whole.

Some reports estimate around 250,000 deaths annually, while others propose figures closer to 400,000. Factors contributing to the discrepancy: The reasons for the different estimates include the difficulty in accurately tracking and attributing deaths to medical errors, the challenges in reporting errors, and the potential for underreporting.
- In 2022, there were approximately 81,806 opioid overdose deaths in the United States. This number represents a significant increase compared to 1999, with current opioid overdose deaths being more than six times higher than they were at the beginning of the opioid epidemic.
- According to the National Missing and Unidentified Persons (NamUS) database, a national clearinghouse and resource center for missing, unidentified, and unclaimed person cases in the U.S., over 600,000 people go missing every year.
