

2026: The Hate Cult vs. Woodstock

You are wrong. You are hateful, violent protesters.

A Helter-Skelter White-Hate, Anti-American Crime Movement

The conduct shown in these videos is disturbing. Nick Shirley is repeatedly subjected to racial and homophobic slurs, including “n—r,” “cracker,” “White boy,” “honkey,” “Nazi,” “KKK,” and “f—t.” Protesters also tell him to kill himself, insult his family and sexuality, accuse him of rape and White supremacy, and repeatedly scream profanity directly in his face.

Members of the crowd attempt to suppress his speech, cover him with jackets, prevent him from walking freely, push him, throw water and a bottle at him, threaten to follow him, and tell him that he is not welcome. They hold up a Mexican flag, direct obscene gestures at him, condemn the police as “fascists,” and declare that they do not want “cops.” They even make the claim that they would rather that we had ISIS than ICE. These are not ordinary expressions of political disagreement; they are acts of terrorism, intimidation, racial hostility and mob harassment.

One person states, “If you do not want violence, you should remove the cause of the violence.” This is blame shifting. It attempts to make the target responsible for the aggression directed against him, even though his presence and speech do not justify assault, threats or harassment.

The police appear to do a commendable job of de-escalating an extremely hostile situation. They remain controlled while trying to protect public safety and prevent the encounter from becoming even more dangerous. Their conduct stands in sharp contrast to the aggression surrounding them.

As I scroll through my professional LinkedIn feed, I continually see requests for prayers for fallen officers. Today, I saw a photograph of an officer’s shoes after he had been shot in the chest. Images like this show why rhetoric portraying every police officer as an enemy can have serious consequences.

The Rochester Park Incident and Unequal Treatment

We recently shared the story titled “Woman Calls Thief N-Word at Park, Goes VIRAL.” The paper states that the woman was sentenced to jail after she experienced theft, doxxing and voyeurism in the park. The accompanying commentary argues that the man recording her exploited what should have remained a private moment of anger after she experienced a theft, while also making clear that the racial word she used should not be used at all.

Update: Upon further investigation, I found that voyeurs do what voyeurs do: they are sex predators. To no surprise, it starts with doxxing. Voyeurism is not normal and should never be accepted by the general public. I feel that Shamar should be deported for committing modern acts of 4GW against the American people.

The man recording her appears to be exploiting what should have remained a private moment of anger after she experienced a theft. I am most concerned about his conduct. The word she used should not be used at all. The issue, however, is unequal treatment. The word is normalized when used by some people, yet treated as hate speech when used by others.

I am angry that this man felt entitled to film her against her will, coercing, manipulating and pressuring her while recording, and then posted identifying footage online, exposing her to a lifetime of abuse and harassment. His conduct should be examined because distributing the footage has caused the most aggravated and lasting harm in this situation.

Filming people against their will and exposing them to online harassment is a serious issue, particularly when it is connected to foreigner militant activism and unequal power dynamics. Even if he began as a bystander, he quickly inserted himself into the situation, placed the entire blame on her, and presented the footage in a way that encouraged the public to believe she was the only person who had done anything wrong. The reality is that she reportedly experienced a theft that had occurred in the park while she was there with her baby. I agree that the neighborhood may no longer feel safe for her if she is experiencing several forms of hostility at once.

The same racial slur appears again in the protest videos, where it is directed toward a White man as though political beliefs excuse its use. If racial degradation is wrong, it must be wrong regardless of the race of the person being targeted. The concern raised by placing these incidents together is unequal treatment: one incident resulted in public condemnation and a jail sentence, while the protest footage is presented as showing racial and sexual abuse directed at another person in a political setting.

The conduct shown here should not be dismissed merely because it occurred at a protest. A crowd that surrounds someone, blocks his movement, screams racial and sexual abuse, throws objects and excuses violence is not behaving peacefully. It is behaving like a hostile mob.

These activists display cruelty, racism and contempt for the rights of an ordinary American citizen. They accuse others of fascism while using intimidation, collective condemnation and attempts at enforced silence. No political movement should receive permission to harass, threaten or assault people while claiming that its cause makes the conduct acceptable.

These videos document conduct that responsible political leaders should condemn plainly and without excuses. Our country cannot preserve equal rights by tolerating racial hatred and political violence whenever the target is considered ideologically unpopular. This is not a protest, it is a hostile cult of hatred, abuse, violence and White targeting.

We used to have Woodstock, now we get this?!
