When Suffering Attacks During Advocacy – Ask Questions More, Remember Argument Logic, Remove Harmful Voices That “Spiritually Whip,” US – Recognize Modern Repression

Verbal Attacks:

Ad hominem attacks such as “You’re childish,” etc., often occur when white women talk about slavery. When these discussions include other races who may be attacking white women in modern contexts, these abuses are often perpetuated by individuals who are not knowledgeable on the subject, are easily agitated, and are unable to look deeply into the complexities of modern slavery.

Instead of working to grasp the full picture, they attack and “spiritually whip” the messenger.

What kinds of abuses can we see today? They can be very volatile, openly assaulting, dehumanizing, degrading, and frankly worrisome.

Still, we endure. Why? Because logic and facts, as well as the intensive study of abuses, slavery, and violence, help us navigate these situations with a fine-precision and sensitive understanding of the verbal injuries being conducted.

Furthermore, as we continue to navigate modern slavery, a natural effect is the development of greater awareness of personal security and safety. This includes removing ourselves from spheres of negative influence and harmful characters.

It also includes locking our doors, both in our physical locations and within our emotional lives.

As time goes on, we become more secure in our understandings of modern slavery and conflict.

I remember during the pandemic when I first experienced my “spiritual revelation.” I was crying out to God for slavery of humans and animals to end, and God answered my prayers.

Through this experience, I came to understand slavery very deeply, the experiences of others, as well as my own, and what freedom really means.

We persevere.

While we may change after gaining wisdom in the field of modern slavery, others may not yet be as aware.

Still, life moves on.

And we do as well.
