Golden Age & Cult Classics

- 1. **Bell, Book and Candle (1958)** A suave, romantic story about a modern witch in New York; stylish and witty.
- 2. **Häxan (1922)** Silent-era Swedish/Danish documentary-style horror exploring witchcraft; visually stunning and eerie.
- 3. **The Witches (1966, Norwegian version)** Darkly atmospheric adaptation, not the family comedy of the 1990s.

- 4. **The Wicker Man (1973)** Folk horror masterpiece featuring pagan rituals; cult classic.
- 5. **Suspiria (1977)** Dario Argento's masterpiece: a witchy dance academy with mesmerizing visuals and haunting score.
- 6. **The Craft (1996)** Modern cult classic about teen witches; stylish, edgy, and influential.
- 7. **Season of the Witch (1973)** Gothic horror with elegant witches and medieval vibes.

- 8. **Black Sunday (1960)** Italian gothic horror with witchcraft and vampiric elements; moody and iconic.
