

Ending Discrimination, Racism, Ethnic and Cultural Erasure of White Americans

- One in five Americans is Latino.
- The overrepresentation of Black people in advertisements is influenced by global brands prioritizing diversity, the impact of Black culture in entertainment, the demographic makeup of major cities like London, and the fact that Black consumers often place a higher value on representation, resulting in a stronger return on investment for advertisers.
