Our intention is to foster good camaraderie, strong sportsmanship, positive morale and genuine respect for one another. In America, we also share one identity, the American team.

For simplicity, these groups are not meant to compete or harm one another, but to create opportunities for cooperation, understanding, and shared growth. We are called to be peaceable and to live freely, honoring both individual identity and collective harmony. We recognize that differences in language, culture, and family experience can make connection more complex, and this is also part of the beauty of multiculturalism.

In America, multiculturalism is something we value and recognize. It must never be used as a means to harm, divide, or diminish another. At our core, we share an American culture that provides a foundation for all communities to remain healthy, peaceful, and able to coexist.

We also ask that American culture not be diminished or disrupted in the name of multiculturalism. In recent years, many people have felt a growing sense of cultural tension, where expressions of identity through public demonstrations, symbols, or rhetoric becomes divisive or dismissive of the American community. The American people, who seek to live in peace, build stable lives, and contribute meaningfully to their communities, feel overwhelmed when cultural expression moves away from mutual respect.

At the end of the day, America is American.

We believe in safeguarding communities through respect and personal responsibility. Multiculturalism should never feel forced, coercive, or intimidating. It should be grounded in understanding and goodwill. There is also a quieter and respectful expression of multiculturalism that we recognize and value. In this space, individuals honor their own heritage while walking alongside others with care, humility, and awareness. Cultural identity exists with others in a shared space of autonomy and dignity.

We are grateful for those who show respect for American culture while honoring their own. We recognize those who move beyond surface level ideas of diversity and focus on the deeper human connection, including autonomy, shared dignity, spirit, and humanity.

Part of the Union of Saints symbology reflects the American spirit. It acknowledges that it has taken many years of growth and development for the Greater American team to come together. While the present moment brings challenges, it also calls us forward to build a shared, compassionate and respectful community where no person's progress is hindered by another.

We are working toward progressive abundance. We are working toward healthy and respectful communities where Americans can stand together with autonomy, dignity, purpose, and *peace*.
