*There is also a serious issue when taxpayer money is siphoned and exploited from hardworking Americans without sufficient consideration for how those policies affect the people who fund them. **When organizations or institutions are only serving people according to their race while simultaneously condemning another racial group as racist, Americans have every right to question that conduct, the allocation of public funds, and whether equal treatment is actually being practiced.** There is a very guilty party here, and it is not those White Americans being exploited. **It’s a blame shift.** Public resources belong to the public, and racial favoritism should never be treated as acceptable simply because it is directed toward a particular group. **Staking claims to identity, property, and territory. Just steal it all and beat them down, too, right? “¡Toma!” That’s what robbers do.***

*The accusation becomes even more disturbing when racial hostility becomes so normalized that it becomes an actual civil war: Fourth Generational Warfare. **Calling someone racist because of their***

skin color, ancestry, or political affiliation is itself radical thinking. It is hypocritical to condemn racism while judging people by race, and it is profoundly unjust to assign collective guilt to millions of individuals because of the actions of a small group of people who came before them. **I'll never forget the woman who used her vehicle in an act of aggression and then called me, "Karen." Someone call the manager! That is assault with a deadly weapon.**

The war has never been more clear. Repeatedly portraying an entire population as oppressors, colonizers, supremacists, or illegitimate Americans creates resentment, division, hostility, and fear, and rhetoric of this kind can contribute to conditions that move a society toward hostile war. **Yet it didn't stop there. The people you claimed as victims? Your people? Massacred our people.** They got put in prison; they got sent home. **Not our home, but their actual, real place of home. They are not Native here. Stop the lies.**

Words have consequences, particularly when they are repeated through political movements and directed against a population as a whole. **This is not a minor issue; it is a serious form of social and psychological warfare.**

How dare anyone come to our country and treat our people as though they are lesser, illegitimate, or inherently guilty because of their race or ancestry? **If you wonder why so many people support deportations and stronger immigration enforcement, you should consider the effect of racism so extreme that it makes Americans feel that their own country, communities, ancestry, and rights are treated as though they have zero value, while the other party has it all. That's genocide.**

Americans have every right to demand secure borders, lawful immigration, responsible use of taxpayer money, equal treatment, and respect for their communities. No political movement should expect people to remain silent while enduring hostile, **foreign** race war. **This isn't a game of cops and robbers. This is our life, our home, our land. I think it's clear you sent your message. Well, did you hear ours?**
