1. "Ethnic intimidation" – Of White Americans, yet rarely discussed.
2. Abuse cycles, manipulation through remorse, intermittent reinforcement, trauma bonding, gaslighting, **coercive guilt** and coercive control.
3. Blame-shift politics: calling people "racist," "nativist," "populist," or "Nazis."
4. Smear campaigns and mass propaganda.
5. Total exclusion of the "White American" perspective, native perspective, or discussion of anti-White racism.
6. Using "minorities" as fuel for Democratic propaganda.
7. Mainstream media being heavily Democratic rather than non-biased.
8. Forced DEI policies and mass immigration as a strategy for instilling fear in local American populations.
9. Ideology being taught as fact.
10. Excusing territorial invasion, smuggling, and trafficking altogether by labeling it "cimmigration" or dissenters as "populist."
11. Gaslight politics.
12. Political extremism, including violence, threats, stalking, and murder.
13. Genocidal hate speech.
14. The vilification of Native Americans and suppression of the Native American voice, despite the territory ultimately belonging to the American people, many of whom have experienced targeting in one form or another.
15. Lack of public resource accountability.
16. Immigration is more extreme in America than in any other country aside from areas affected by war, and yet Democrats still support further mass migration efforts that herd new "colonies" into historically established ones, essentially replacing local populations with an entirely new foreign culture.
17. Many prominent Jewish, Russian and German authors at this time in history.
18. Forcing open-border policies on a territory that so clearly does not want them through force, fear, and intimidation policies.
19. Placing Americans, specifically White Americans, in a great number of negative media articles regarding immigration. Few articles support the American people.
20. Despite projections that one child in three (34%) would be an immigrant or the child of an immigrant by 2050, Americans still remain suppressed, their population steadily replaced and dwindling, and many do not feel comfortable with forced immigration policy. Despite these extreme numbers of foreign populations, their voices are still not heard.
