

Proposal

Federal Public Servant Protection and Mission Interference Act

Union of Saints

Purpose

To establish federal criminal penalties for knowingly and intentionally stalking, threatening, doxing, engaging in human trafficking or trafficking-related offenses, surveilling for criminal purposes, or interfering with the official duties of federal public servants.

Findings

Congress finds that:

- Federal public servants perform essential governmental functions that protect the safety and security of the United States.
- Certain individuals and organized groups have engaged in conduct intended to intimidate, harass, threaten, or interfere with federal officials while they perform official duties.
- Existing federal laws prohibit many forms of assault, threats, obstruction, and trafficking-related offenses, but Congress may strengthen protections against coordinated stalking and intentional mission interference directed at public servants.

Covered Personnel

This Act applies to all public servants, including but not limited to:

- U.S. Border Patrol Agents
- ICE Officers and Agents
- Customs and Border Protection personnel
- Federal law enforcement officers
- Federal correctional officers
- Federal prosecutors and judges
- State and local law enforcement officers
- Military personnel
- Veterans
- Emergency responders

Prohibited Conduct

It shall be unlawful to knowingly and intentionally:

1. Stalk a covered public servant because of official duties in a manner intended to intimidate, threaten, or substantially interfere with those duties.
2. Conduct coordinated surveillance or tracking for the purpose of facilitating harassment, violence, obstruction, trafficking, or other criminal activity.
3. Physically interfere with or obstruct a lawful public safety or governmental operation.
4. Intentionally impede access to operational areas, facilities, or equipment during an official mission.
5. Encourage, organize, finance, or coordinate others to commit acts prohibited under this Act as part of a criminal conspiracy.
6. Publish or distribute personal identifying information with the intent to facilitate threats, violence, trafficking, or unlawful harassment.
7. Knowingly create, administer, or use a website, application, online platform, or other digital service for the primary purpose of facilitating criminal stalking, doxing, unlawful surveillance, trafficking, threats, intimidation, or intentional interference with the official duties or lawful missions of covered public servants.

Penalties

Depending on the offense:

- Misdemeanor for minor intentional interference.
- Felony where conduct involves stalking, threats, trafficking, organized conspiracy, substantial interference, or the knowing use of a website or digital platform to facilitate criminal conduct prohibited by this Act.
- Enhanced penalties where:
 - bodily injury occurs;
 - firearms or dangerous weapons are involved;
 - organized criminal enterprises or conspiracies are involved;
 - terrorism-related offenses are established under existing federal law.

Objectives

The Act seeks to:

- Protect the safety of public servants.
- Reduce intimidation directed at government personnel.

- Improve mission effectiveness.
- Deter organized harassment, trafficking, and obstruction.
- Protect public servants from the criminal misuse of websites and digital platforms.
- Preserve constitutional freedoms while preventing criminal conduct.

Proposal: Public Servant Protection and Mission Interference Act

The purpose of this proposal is to strengthen protections for public servants who perform essential duties in service to our communities and our nation.

The proposal would establish enhanced federal criminal penalties for individuals who knowingly and intentionally:

- Stalk public servants because of their official duties.
- Coordinate unlawful surveillance or tracking to facilitate criminal activity.
- Interfere with lawful government operations or emergency response missions.
- Dox or unlawfully publish personal identifying information with criminal intent.
- Organize or participate in criminal conspiracies targeting public servants.
- Knowingly use websites or digital platforms to facilitate criminal stalking, doxing, intimidation, trafficking, or unlawful mission interference.

The proposal recognizes the critical role of federal, state, and local law enforcement, Border Patrol, ICE, Customs and Border Protection, military personnel, veterans, prosecutors, judges, correctional officers, and emergency responders in serving the public.

At the same time, it is intended to preserve constitutional protections, including peaceful protest, lawful journalism, public oversight, and protected speech, while addressing intentional criminal conduct directed at those carrying out public service.

Constructive feedback and thoughtful discussion are welcome as we continue exploring ways to improve public safety, support those who serve, and strengthen the rule of law.
