

Modern White Slavery Movements (Anti-American Movements)

Conclusions: Asians are allowed to support Asians. Indians are allowed to support Indians. Mexicans are allowed to support Mexicans. Native Americans are allowed to support Native Americans. Black Americans are allowed to support Black Americans. LGBT individuals are allowed to support LGBT individuals. Jews are allowed to support Jews. Palestinians are allowed to support Palestinians. Latin Americans are allowed to support Latin Americans.

White Americans, however, must endure severe cultural and social harms, which include dehumanization, degradation, and normalized racism. This includes hate speech, vitriol, and even murder, without any social repercussions. The normalization of protections and safety offered to other races, while socially excluding White members of society, especially from rights spheres, has resulted in grave and violent consequences.

While all races are considered protected classes, discrimination and racism toward White Americans endures and is excused, affecting individuals who never partook in historical slavery and who may even be victims of present slavery. Yet violence, discrimination, demographic manipulation, extreme mobilizations, societal exclusion, cultural harms, and total erasure in some areas of society continue, as racial targeting endures.

American society is still very young, where much of the majority population was White in previous generations, at 80 percent, and Christian, and where Whites at this time in history have been strongly sought after for their underground slavery value, yielding high profits for traffickers, and where Christians have been targeted, with daily killings recorded. It is imperative that communication and social cultural standards change to represent the current moment in history and the current injustices facing all Americans. This must include Whites.

Furthermore, it should be held that White Americans, as any race, deserve equal protections and the ability to voice their rights, opinions, and speech regarding White protections. White Americans reserve the right to safe spaces as any others. Mobilizing for White Americans is no different than mobilizing for other Americans. Where severe harms, violence, rape, and murder occur and are racially motivated, expecting that White Americans will not express these harms or will not work to protect themselves is a far cry from reality.

We hold the position that removing protections from Whites, vilifying Whites, and actively working to lower Whites as a form of activism is a form of terrorism, as it ultimately supports race war rather than race protection. Where a great majority may be considered minority or Black races, and where a great deal work together to actively target one race, the White race, it has become factually evident, in this view, that Whites are not only harmed for their race and skin color but also for their culture, which is removed, erased, and undermined. Whites are also actively targeted by supremacy movements that seek subjugation and exploitation.

These activist movements have led to political movements that are far left biased, changing America from within to promote dehumanization and degradation of Whites through higher taxes, financial penalties, and DEI or DRE practices that remove a majority population in order to support a minority or foreign one, regardless of current participation numbers. For

example, a student body may have a minority White population, yet discrimination against Whites continues, as other races are prioritized.

These understandings are known, yet racial profiling, racism, targeting, and discrimination have endured. Messaging has been presented as promoting equality; however, these actions do not reflect true equality. Racism and social harm toward Whites is not an equality movement.

Slavery existed in many areas of the United States without the participation of entire cultural enclaves of White populations, and White populations also endured slavery, genocide, and racial politics. These experiences were rarely discussed and were erased, in part, to benefit early American society and British forces. Today, we assert that anti White politics and anti White history benefit other races and dehumanize Whites. There is no excuse for this.

The final conclusion regarding these matters is that DEI/DRE have expressed as societal harms. Furthermore, activism politics promoting White harm, we now describe as terrorism and feel it must be addressed and never excused. Any organized crimes targeting Whites and accompanying social waves of experience must not be excused, and when they are simply excused as “race politics,” it is deeply disturbing. The KKK behaves no differently. This is “clan” and terrorist behavior.

Enslaving or holding another human being hostage is never excusable, regardless of an individual’s skin color. This is false ideology paving the way for modern slavery and crime to exist and even be accepted. We describe this experience as “racial criminal supremacy,” where criminals are glorified because of their skin color, and others are left to suffer because of race.

There is deep concern regarding these findings, and we hold that race politics must be addressed directly. Society should move toward a healthy and mature standard in which all individuals are recognized as human beings. This is not a debate, it is a demand, and it should be understood that there are repercussions for participating in racially motivated violence.

Criminals, especially murderers, violent offenders, and those who commit acts of terror, rape or sustained harm, must be held accountable where necessary.

There is no room for dehumanization in the modern world. Racial targeting will not be tolerated, and any activist who actively seeks to harm others, especially Whites, during a time of mass suicide, dwindling White race crisis, and normalized targeting must be held accountable.

Write their names on the chalkboard. Take them to the police. Take them to court. Do whatever it takes to stop the targeting and vilification of Americans. Discrimination and harm against White Americans stops here.
