垫 1. Legal Frame: IIED

Intentional Infliction of Emotional Distress (IIED) occurs when:

- Conduct is extreme and outrageous,
- · Done intentionally or recklessly,
- Causing severe emotional distress.

f Examples in this context: graphic taunting about killing animals, persistent ridicule, or hostile environments.

2. Discrimination Against Non-Animal Consuming Citizens

- Workplace/School: No non-animal meal options; jokes about their beliefs.
- Housing/Community: Dismissed requests (e.g., pesticide use).
- Social Life: Centering conversations on animal consumption despite objections.

3. Religious Discrimination Against the Saints

- Many saints practice **non-animal consumption** as part of their faith, tied to peace, compassion, and stewardship.
- Discrimination looks like:
 - · Mocking prayer or peace practices.
 - · Forcing participation in animal consumption events.
 - Excluding or marginalizing them as "fanatical."
- U.S. Law: Religion is a protected class—faith-based dietary practices may be protected too.

4. Harmful Conversations

- Respectful: "Can I ask what your practice means to you?"
- Insensitive: "I had a steak last night."
- Provocative: "Bacon though!" or graphic hunting stories.
- for To saints, this is not casual talk—it can be harassment or spiritual violation.

5. Why Protection Matters

- Peace: Guarding spiritual and emotional balance.
- Identity: Non-animal consuming citizens live by conscience, not "preference."
- Dignity: Respect affirms belonging.
- Law: IIED + religious discrimination laws provide remedies.

6. Guidelines for Respect

For Saints & Non-Animal Consuming Citizens

- Name the belief: "This is part of my faith/ethics."
- Set boundaries: "I'd rather not hear stories about killing animals."
- Document incidents.
- Seek support (HR, advocacy, faith communities).

For Others

- Respect boundaries.
- · Provide accommodations.
- Avoid mockery or provocation.
- Practice curiosity, not confrontation.

7. Core Reminder

Every word either:

Humanizes → affirms peace, dignity, and belonging.

- **Dehumanizes** \rightarrow ridicules, isolates, and violates conscience.

Protecting saints and non-animal consuming citizens is both a legal right and a sacred duty.
