Summary: *Where are the protections for Ethnic White Americans?*

For context: A small population of Acadians remains in Louisiana. Is this population not a minority? While never the majority, they were once the “dominant” population. Today, they are no longer the dominant population, as Louisiana has experienced many major demographic transitions.

Forced mass migration and the “view” of globalism as “minorityism” within American culture are harming Americans, specifically White Americans, as they promote others above them and actively exclude Whites, even when they are the minority in many situations. Our culture is still young and evolving, and many White Americans feel they have little chance within a landscape that actively suppresses them. It creates national and community security risks. The voices of incoming populations are replacing the voices of locals and natives, placing their lives at risk.

There are grave concerns, including concerns related to terrorism. American culture is not invincible to incoming nations, and at this point in history, our country, people, and spirit are being harmed. Americans are human. At this time, we are experiencing “energetic and real slavery” in efforts to keep communities safe from terrorism, violence, trafficking, and newcomer politics, and “extreme left politics.” This reality may be compared to periods of war and political instability, including wartime conditions such as those seen during WW2. The bird flu was used as a period during which the Nazis gained momentum while continuing to blame and smear local populations for the grave harms they themselves caused.

Taking in unvetted people from around the world and turning them into an American minority population is not the way forward. It creates a system of “victimhood” as a form of foreign power while actively erasing the culture, safety, victimhood and historical identity within that culture, with little concern for local populations. The world is not a minority population within our small country. It is not just a mistake; it is a grave mistake.

Too many newcomers are actively fighting to “make the rules” within American culture while suppressing the voices and representation of Americans, and they have, so far, had great success. At this point in history, ethnic White Americans, Black Americans, and Native Americans make far less than many immigrant populations, specifically those from BRICS nations. While we celebrate their success, it should not come at the cost of ours. This should be a given.

These experiences are creating a dangerous political landscape for the American people, and we feel that the power structures created to support immigrants in politics over the American people should be reconsidered through all future actions. We feel Americans must be afforded the seats first, or else we risk losing our country to people who care far less about the American people. We must care for and consider the value of American lives now before it is too late. Protect Americans. Vote no on acts that work to serve only immigrant (“new nation”) populations over the American people.
