32-year-old Dominican national facing federal prison after Massachusetts Hampshire drug conspiracy trafficking multiple kilograms of meth

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32-year-old Dominican national facing federal prison after Mass



CONCORD –A citizen of the Dominican Republic who is currently unlawfully present in the United States, pleaded guilty in federal court to one count of Conspiracy to Distribute and Possess with Intent to Distribute a Controlled Substance, United States Attorney Cregan and FBI Boston announced in a release.

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According to court documents and statements made in court, in late 2023, law enforcement agencies began investigating a drug-trafficking organization involving 32-year-old Aguasvivas-Pena, operating in New Hampshire and Massachusetts. During the conspiracy, the DTO trafficked multiple kilograms of methamphetamine.

The charging statute provides for a sentence of not less than 10 years and up to federal prison, at least five years of supervised release, and a maximum fine of \$1 million. U.S. District Court Judge Joseph Laplante scheduled sentencing for August 11, 2024.

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The Federal Bureau of Investigation Major Offender Task Force led the investigation with valuable assistance from the Drug Enforcement Administration, Strafford County Office, and Boston Police Department. Assistant U.S. Attorney Yasir Sadat is prosecuting the case.
