Unfortunately, patterns of violence, vandalism, intimidation, and reckless behavior have appeared across some American cities. These individuals may act without regard for who is harmed, often believing their actions are justified. Simply put, criminal behavior is still criminal behavior, regardless of the justification used to defend it. Their conduct can resemble organized intimidation tactics that spread fear throughout communities.

Some individuals involved in these activities have engaged in dangerous acts, including reckless driving, attempted hit-and-runs, harassment, and intimidation. Their targets may be people of any race or background. It is important to remain cautious on roadways, sidewalks, and in public spaces, particularly during times or in areas where visibility and public awareness are reduced.

If you witness criminal activity, prioritize your safety and contact local law enforcement when appropriate. If it is safe to do so, document important details such as vehicle descriptions, license plates, locations, dates, and times. Community awareness, lawful reporting, accountability, and public safety measures are important in helping protect neighborhoods and maintaining safe public environments.
