

## BREAKING: Nation's Most Fed-Up Americans Take To Streets To Protest People Who Took To Streets

In a bold display of public engagement, thousands of deeply irritated Americans flooded downtown areas today to protest the ever-growing number of protests happening across the country.

"We're not against protesting," said one protester, holding a sign that read '*STOP ALL THE SIGNS*'. "We're just against... this much protesting. It's getting excessive. At this point, I don't even know what anyone's mad about anymore, including myself."

Eyewitnesses reported a confusing but passionate scene, as multiple groups of protestors attempted to out-chant each other, occasionally pausing to ask what exactly they were chanting for. At one point, a third group briefly formed to protest both sides before disbanding after agreeing they were all equally annoying.

Local officials confirmed they are monitoring the situation closely, though one admitted, "We're honestly not sure who would even file a permit for this. Is it one protest? Is it three? Is it a protest of protests? Legally, we may be in uncharted territory."

Meanwhile, nearby residents expressed concern over rising noise levels, with one stating, "I tried to join just so I could ask them to keep it down, but then someone handed me a sign and now I think I'm part of it."

At press time, organizers announced plans for a follow-up demonstration next week, aimed at protesting how ineffective today's protest of protests turned out to be.
