## New Normal, Reality Shift

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### Understandings:

Anti-ICE protestors are primarily driven by opposition to immigration crackdowns, with a diverse demographic that includes community residents, activists, and younger, politically liberal individuals, often aligning with Democratic, Latino/Hispanic, and Black populations.

#### Key Demographics and Characteristics

- **Political Alignment:** Protests are largely supported by individuals with a liberal or progressive political lean, with 79% of recent race and equality protest attendees aligning with or leaning toward the Democratic Party.
- **Diverse Demographic Base:** Protest groups include a high representation of younger Americans and racial and ethnic minorities, with broader protests showing higher engagement from Hispanic (22%) and Black Americans (17%).
- **Community Residents:** In cities like Chicago, activists include residents motivated to protect their neighbors, many of whom are not traditionally involved in politics but are concerned about local, non-criminal individuals being targeted.
- **Ideological Motives:** Participants are often motivated by an urgent need to protect undocumented immigrants, resisting what they perceive as federal overreach.

#### Support Base Demographics

- **Party Breakdown:** Support for restricting ICE comes from 91% of Democrats and 66% of independents, while only 19% of Republicans hold this view.

Cowdrey, who studied modern war and slavery intensively, feels that Americans are not grasping the full picture of modern slavery and organized crime as it affects Americans.

The current perspective is skewed and biased against white Americans.

Whereas white Americans, at this point in history, appear to be more protective of their native country.

## Personal Note by Cowdrey:

I feel that Democratic anarchists are currently posing a danger to our country. After four years of witnessing “forced medicine and mask agendas,” the “power shifting” toward foreigners and diversity initiatives “over me” as a white woman, and the daily racism I experienced from Hispanic individuals in the South, as well as the attacks I endured by Black individuals, my perspective changed.

After repeated violent experiences, I was “jolted” from the “fixed loops” of my societal awareness. I was filmed against my will by a Jewish/Russian first-born activist, and my awareness grew regarding abuses by modern Democrats, as their party shifted toward anarchistic and terrorist behavior, with underground “vendettas” against our military and government.

Bizarre rites took place, images of women shuffled between prostitution and “purity,” with the leveraging of prostitution and the labeling of women who dissented as “jealous,” as well as other bizarre cult narratives taking shape.

I witnessed genocide, and what once was speech for peace became talks of murdering political opponents. And then the political assassinations ensued, even the president.

White targeting out in the open and visible, Ukrainian Iryna Zarutka, and Charlie Kirk—I watched the bullet strike him, and the Democratic voice struck harder; his wife was blamed.

Activists have set fires, carried out acid attacks against girls, targeted synagogues and other religious institutions. Violence is frequent, accountability is rare.

Women’s advocacy? Far from it. Any white female on the Republican side is now labeled “KKKaren,” a new designator for any woman with blonde hair who disagrees with the Democratic opinion.

Foreign journalists outweighed American opinion in politics, especially on topics such as medicine. Meanwhile, bioweapons were brought in from overseas, the tip of the iceberg.

Thousands of trafficker arrests, yet a drop of water in the pond—99%+ of traffickers go unnoticed. Their targeting reaches the spotlight, however: 1 in 4 victims, an entire population of victims, of predators.

Still, the reality of the “essence” remains—traffickers have their qualities and characteristics. For the trained, even their silence in shadows is a tell.

The current Democratic view is supported greatly by international voices, including the infiltration of the party by enemy foreigners, among other concerns.

My whole life, I supported Democratic and diversity initiatives. I never questioned the faiths of immigrants and only ever saw vulnerability with victims throughout history. I always cared

about those who suffered injustices while ignoring and suppressing my own. I suppressed my own experiences because my culture taught me to do so.

Whereas other races and immigrants have been provided a platform, white American women and girls have not, and especially not white men.

We are fighting to have our voices heard while being portrayed as “racists,” or worse.

The symbol of the male predator endures; still, the symbol of the male protector does also. We look to the men who warned us, who are doing all they can to safeguard our borders and our nation. Their voices now shine, and we hope that, in time, the women on the Democratic side will begin to hear them.

The male predator puts the conman in communication, far from isolated. They rely on networks. They may operate alone or in groups. One thing is for sure: it is the network that amplifies their harms worldwide; the world is their pride.

Ouch—most harmful of all, rapid demographic shifts, especially post-pandemic, they affect those affected the most, the dwindling population, more voice suppression. May the voices of the victims therefore be raised, and finally heard.

As I have looked deeply into organized crime and slavery, including criminal activity by Hispanic and Black organized cells, as well as Russian and Israeli crime groups within the United States, as well as Muslim or Islamic terrorism against Americans, along with targeting of white individuals by international actors, my opinion has changed.

I see the war. I understand modern slavery. I did my best to advocate. I was not heard. Instead, I was “systematically” shadow-banned. I was bullied, and my voice was violently repressed.

Many of our people are not yet aware. When they are and speak openly, they endure World War 2-style shame tactics. Worse, they violently oppose the truth and blame the messenger.

Bias within white communities can also worsen this, as whites may silence other whites. However, the facts and evidence, as we continually interpret them, inform our case summaries and reflect the current reality of human trafficking and modern warfare, as well as strategic violent targeting by both foreign and domestic actors. These actors may function cohesively or asymmetrically while still aiding one another.

I do my best to express this perspective while including all forms of extremism. I believe that women, guided by compassion, are often at the forefront but can often be influenced by naivety regarding the organized criminal world. 40% image-based abuse targeting is not a number to ignore. Compassion should not come at the cost of personal safety, and certainly not the safety and security of a nation.

I believe the Democratic view at this time in history is “magical” rather than realistic, and national security is not up for debate. Our society is still “young-minded” regarding slavery and modern warfare. No, I do not trust young voices who aim to “dismantle” our military leading the nation, the opposite. Furthermore, organizations that seek recruitment via

psychological warfare against our military target college youth. Activists are not cool enough for school, still their target market? In essence, they robustly support smugglers and trafficking networks while simultaneously and dichotomously advocating for human rights. So long as they are not white American rights.

I am disappointed by the corruption within political spheres. While there is a place for activism, dismantling our military and targeting Americans is not something I support, let's call it a "*da*" moment. In summary, the Democratic party has lost its way. "Lost voices in space?" A new face: More room for organized criminal networks to emerge.
