

## Reflections

What I discovered is that, unfortunately, “Jews” are not immune to war. Unfortunately, there seems to be a “missing link” with full integration for those within the trafficking realms. For unknowing people, they may believe that there is full integration, and for many there is, yet, unfortunately, for the more political and disconnected, there is this belief that “whites” are different, and a challenge is posed, now “Aryans,” or compared to “Germans.” Sadly, the door to hostilities is aggravated. Those disconnected, not only open the door to hostilities but call on others to join in on the unfortunate, racial harming of whites, specifically white women, where vulnerable.

It would seem that this racism persisted post–World War II, and one can understand in part why. The Holocaust is one of the most disturbing events that humans have witnessed. Americans today, now in shock, have witnessed Palestine, Russia, and Ukraine. They are defending themselves against cartels and forced mass demographic changes, and also defending what they are coming to know as a domestic and foreign territorial war, in which a state, a political Jewish state, they were mostly unaware of, seeks to suppress, torture, and harm them.

I think that I share with many Americans the sentiment that these new political waves are too great to ignore. Americans themselves are very compassionate and open; we are a free people, we are a diverse people, we are also a white people. We are a people who believe in humanity, though, certainly, the wiser, do not forfeit their own survival in order to support others who seek to harm us. We are paying attention.

I am grateful to know others who are Jewish by faith, and the problem was never with the general and fully integrated Jewish population. Our problem rather, as it has always been, is political, is the extremism, is the forcing against our will as a people. It is often those activists who simply were not able to put their racism or radical ideology aside and chose to deliberate one form of assault or another. In this case, I speak of the harms caused against the American population, who now hurry to find the answers to what went wrong, why millions of undocumented immigrants are now in our country, many who seek to harm us, and why so many are fighting, violently so, to keep these individuals here.

Questions of the Holocaust arise, and comparisons are drawn; one can understand why, there are parallels. However, the truth remains, America is America’s home front, and Americans have a right to protect themselves, especially where their people are being targeted, enslaved, and subjected to warfare.

We look to the data, our casework, and then we circle back. It is all there, one cruelty, one harm, one misstep at a time, never skipping a beat. It was a marching cadence, one which marched on American territory and sought to harm the American people, specifically American whites, though we recognize all Americans were harmed in this process. There was, assuredly, a movement which sought supremacy over white Americans, most of whom were

unsuspecting, simply working and doing their best to support their families. They are the general population, after all, hardly political. They vote and discuss politics here and there, still, their lives are mostly centered around their home and heart, their children, and their families, those very things that are being harmed by forced mass migrations and their supporters. Across the board, the evidence is clear.

We, as Americans, have a duty to our country. And I must say, as a vegetarian, I can remember many people would warn, on the less political side, that Hitler was a vegetarian. What I realized later was that Hitler was not the only vegetarian, and that there were movements, on all sides, movements, like we have today, that frankly, got out of control. Safety, security, compassion, and humanity should have been the primary goals, although this was not what occurred. This history repeats.

Jewish faith is interesting in that it carries its own forms of "Aryanism," that is, to be Jewish, and also, that those who "look Aryan" are those they may be prejudiced towards, non-Jewish whites. For many Americans, this is confusing, as we never saw a white Jewish person as being non-white, perhaps an immigrant to our country, we simply saw white as it was. That is, until we experienced the recent Cold War, and our people experienced slavery and torture by our foreign and domestic enemies. We look specifically to the Russian side, the Kompromat side, those we are sadly in a war with. I believe I share this sentiment with many Americans, as civilians, we do not seek war, though where targeted, we have fallen victim to it, and so we choose to take a stand.

And when victimized to this extent, we tend to wonder: why? A deeper look into history, and a deeper look into ourselves and our present experience. We are facing a very honest thing, a very real and raw thing, to be forced into human slavery by those we felt we could trust carries a certain weight, a hollowing, if you will. It calls into question the humanity that is no longer present, why, and who?

And what a wonderful woman, an American woman, an American black woman, an American white woman, for she is free, and spiritual, and beautiful, also kind, loving, and forgiving. In America, she is more Christ-like. Still, America, as our homeland, just as Israel is viewed as the homeland of Jews, is a home we defend.

And where slavery and warfare are strengthened in order to harm Americans, Americans have a right to self-defense. It has become evident, more than ever, that there are political players who are not playing for the American side. In fact, they are harming Americans, and sadly, from within our own country. This country we so humbly share.

A modern suffrage, a grand assault, and even after Americans said no, loudly so, these assaults continued, with no end in sight. A Cold War became a Hot War, and these political players, for the other side, profited from the injustices caused against the American people. Now a profit is made, and Americans pay the bill. Yet, Americans never signed up for slavery.
