

## **DIGNIDAD — The Dignity Act**

### **Goes Against American Choice and Dignity, Americans Have Already Said No**

Represents coercion, compulsion, and policies that incentivize mass instrumental immigration while placing additional burdens on American citizens and communities. The proposal risks advancing political and demographic objectives to which many Americans have not consented and that may undermine national sovereignty and public trust.

A prudent fiscal analysis counsels against adoption of the Dignity Act. While framed as humanitarian reform, the legislation would expand long-term eligibility pressures on public benefits, infrastructure, and social services at a time when housing, healthcare, and welfare systems already face capacity constraints and rising costs borne largely by state and local taxpayers.

Beyond fiscal exposure, durable public policy must also safeguard American cohesion and spiritual harmony, principles grounded in shared responsibility, cultural continuity, and confidence in the rule of law. Rapid population shifts without commensurate planning risk social destabilization, cultural dissonance, and strain on community institutions, thereby eroding faith in responsible government stewardship.

Accordingly, from both a budgetary and societal stability perspective, restraint and responsible stewardship for the American people better serve the nation's safety, security, and long-term interests.

### **Vote No on Dignidad.**

Our demographic landscape is already changing rapidly, and against the will of the American people. Americans deserve compassion, fairness, stability, and a meaningful voice in policies that shape the future of their nation.

Due to national security considerations, including smuggling, trafficking, cold war activities, and foreign malign information campaigns, the United States should prioritize policies that protect its citizens, preserve social stability, and responsibly manage voluntary and state-regulated deportations in the national interest.
