

## **Cowdrey's Reaction**

Innocent American society was not prepared.

Americans revered Jewish people for a long time; all we knew was that they were harmed in the Holocaust. Our communities are very innocent and naive. It was not long ago that the television was invented. Many of our families grew up with rotary phones. Our grandparents listened to Elvis. They grew up in small villages with all their friends and family. They would go to drive in movie theaters and drink root beer floats on Saturdays. The truth is, we are mourning a lot. People have taken advantage of the innocence of Americans.

The world has pushed White Americans into a category, but much of it is a generalization. For many White communities who also had Black members of society, these individuals were just like anyone else and were welcomed with open hearts and love. They were not seen as any different; we were all friends and family. The South definitely had a different air about it. Society in the South was full of negative politics and slavery related harms that continued on through the decades.

As we have come to understand, individuals within Jewish culture were very much a part of this Confederacy, the fight for Southern slavery. Learning about Jewish and German politics is relatively new to many Americans. We simply were not there, and all we knew was what we were taught, that the Jews suffered in Germany. Our honorary veterans fought there. That was pretty much it. Unless you were a history buff, most Americans were frankly busy enjoying life and spending time with their families.

Societies were simpler. The internet and information age did not become a thing until recent years, the 1990s. Most of us can remember the years of Pac Man. We have come a long way, but we are still learning. Sadly, we reflect in hindsight and new knowledge appears, as Palestine showcases severe injustices, and we reconcile with the harms Americans are currently suffering from activists who seem to show little humanity toward innocent White Americans, many of whom have been severely and repeatedly targeted at this time in history.

We are talking about rural, isolated, predominantly White American communities that have nothing to do with politics, except voting during elections and occasional heated or jocular debates. They were simply raised with healthy, "normal societal values." They voted; politicians did the rest. We all got along, we all were friends, we were happy. It was all the same; we could go to the lake, see another family, and we would all get along. Times were peaceful. There was less violence, and that was what made life so great; we were free. We were proud to be American.

Our grandparents' upbringing was very simple, and most wish they could go back. Life was great. Our families instilled in us beautiful lessons and values throughout this lifetime. Most of us just kind of want to be left alone. We do not want to have to fight new immigrant cultures or compete with "new nation political schemes." We do not want to lose everything, our culture and our sovereignty, to "diversity initiatives" that seek to change us, and rapidly so. We do not want to witness our culture's erasure or be made out to be villains for simply wanting to live our lives in peace and free from violence and harm. We like things being simple.

So when we endure a cold war, and we isolate the issues, and come to know better those individuals who are causing that harm, it tends to change our opinion about our visitors. Especially when these visitors, new residents, and their children actively build places where we are not welcome, and worse, they build modern war and slavery rings. They choose to target specific individuals, Americans, those we know and love, because of power plays, hatred, and revenge politics. If Americans are out of the way, it would make things easier, right? If Whites are out of the way, then the lives of newcomers in America will be easier.

Many people in the North and Native Americans get along great. We revered the Native Americans; we were friends. We honored the Native Americans through our shared spirit, which is very much embodied by many Northern Americans. Native American culture is a part of who we are. Some of us forgot through time where our first tribes were, Acadia, for example, as a result of erasure and centuries upon centuries of change. However, our shared spirit remains.

And so, when forced to succumb to the pain and suffering caused by mass migrations, invasions, and territorial warfare, we get lost in the politics. This is not the America we know and love, nor has it ever been the injustice we would seek to cause to the Native Americans. We know in our hearts that colonialism causes harm to Native American populations; that is us.

Sadly, I am a victim of a lifetime of really brutal experiences, extreme violence in which I had no control, except defense. I think it is important that I say this. I did defend myself, and I am not ashamed that I did. I am proud that I was able to defend myself, because we get to know different parts of ourselves when given no choice but to survive and stand our ground. I assuredly had to learn how to survive. Our culture is violent. I believe it has become increasingly violent over time. Perhaps we were able to pretend it away at times, but something happens to our spirit when we choose to defend ourselves; we become better human beings, we evolve. It is important that we defend ourselves and our values.

What seemed to harm me the most, and I choose to speak my mind here because I think it is important, is that I was taken advantage of. I was forced against my will. I was voyeured repeatedly by a first born immigrant who happened to be a Soviet Jewish individual. It hurt deeply because, at the time, it did not make sense to me. I was very vulnerable and I was very naive. I was also forgiving, loving, and kind. I wanted to think the best of the situation, to remain positive. Still, the manipulation ensued, and these skilled targetings continued. The reality of my America shifted, and I learned of other victims of Soviet Jews. My learning continued.

On and on, the negative propaganda and political campaigns of eugenics, anti White Americanism, disturbing and bizarre rites, child slavery, organ trafficking, fraud and mafias, bizarre art and history, polyamory and BDSM, pornography peddling, targeting within the pornography industry, political trafficking and Kompromat campaigns, Christian targeting overseas, Palestinian targeting, humiliation and shame campaigns, and Jewish women and girls becoming victims as well. It is complicated, and it is certainly difficult to discern, especially for innocent and naive Americans. Americans just do not know; they often do not know until they become victims. They are targeted over and over again without knowledge of who or why is targeting them, until it is too late.

They have suffered so much that the pain is unbearable. This type of targeting, especially slavery targeting and manipulation at this level, is a genocidal and Holocaust expression. There is no denying a pain like this. It is caused by mass political movements shaped by individuals with clear negative intentions within these realms. Where more than half of those targeted considered suicide, it is assuredly a wake up call.

Americans are not usually this anxious, depressed, and heartbroken; our societies are naturally more positive, free, and healthy. What has become of society is, no doubt, a result of modern slavery and American targeting, of unchecked violence and abuse, of not holding perpetrators of violent crime and terrorism accountable, especially sex terrorism. It feels as if a knife is taken to a human being's most intimate parts of their spiritual being. It takes the soul and siphons it out of the person, leaving them hollow, weak, suffering, and in the dark.

It truly takes a strong individual to make it through these dark places, and many Americans do not survive. This is what we have witnessed within White American society, and there is no denying this. The cold war has continued. There are responsible parties, and at this time in history, I do believe that the world is becoming more aware. I feel that victimization will continue until society chooses to push back.

Generalizing against Jewish people is, most obviously, un American. We know that this is not the experience of all Jewish people. That would include a great deal of the world, many of whom are not even aware that they have Jewish ancestry. This is not about genes, families, or people. This is about culture, politics, and choice, a choice to harm, a choice to torture, a choice to choose evil.

Do I feel that boundaries should be established within normal society and Jewish culture? It depends. It depends on the family, the people, and their heart and soul. However, do I feel that American girls should date Jewish men? If I am being honest, and I think I should be, at this time in history, not quite.

I say no because of trafficking, polyamory, animal sacrifices, forced marriages and dress, where women are forced to wear full coverings, and the continuation of pedophilia practices that are normalized within this religion, disgusting circumcision rites. Society has boundaries, and there is an intolerance that continues to go unchecked. These rites disturb any normal, healthy society, and yet they continue. Normal societal boundaries are not respected; as a natural symptom, autonomy, dignity, and freedom are challenged.

These rites cause harm to those within the faith and to society at large, and yet they continue. Boyfriending and husbanding continue. It targets Jewish women and girls, and it targets American women and girls. It is a religious cultural norm, and this culture seems to openly teach harms, including the enslavement of non Jews. Many within this organization take the Torah, seriously. Like any religion great values are taught. Still, it is the racism that normalizes "Jew vs. Gentile" and "goy," as well as other bizarre and unhealthy behaviors. It causes separation, but worse, it fuels the idealization of supremacy movements.

We can also see rebellions within this faith, which is a natural effect of religious targeting. The Holocaust was the most disturbing event in history. Still, wherever vulnerable people are targeted, these

harms must not go without accountability. This is what we are seeing today, revenge politics and movements that seek to target vulnerable people with no accountability. In our case, Americans.

I am unhappy with the direction my country is headed at the cost of democratic movements and feel that modern slavery has largely been disregarded for one reason alone, their party is participating in it. Just as with modern forms of warfare, Democrats are indeed participating, and those they rely on for safety, our public servants, are not only being vilified, they are being attacked. Doxxed, filmed against their will, stalked, families targeted, homes set on fire, shot.

Like watching a needy, spoiled, uncontrolled toddler have a temper tantrum, all we can do is watch in embarrassment until they stop. The entitlement is so disturbing that arson has become an acceptable norm within this party. Arson is Holocaust, by the way; fire was foundational. By members of activist Jewish culture, the Holocaust was birthed; it was normalized. This is a history that should not be denied. It started with animals and ended the life of millions of human beings. Still, it is important to remember, ideology is not an act; the choice to harm is.

As with many experiences, knowledge is power, and the truth shall set us free. It is through my research and pursuit of truth that I have found freedom and begun healing. Though it has taken five years to heal, I have not stopped researching the events that transpired.

I conclude with renewed understandings of World War II. I feel that as long as harms within the Jewish faith are allowed to continue, our humanity will suffer. As a victim, I understand this sentiment, though I feel that this is true of any faith or any people who cause harm. I do feel this is especially true, however, of those currently perpetuating acts of cold war on American soil. It is predatorial; it targets vulnerable Americans. This is my native country that the cold war has caused suffering to, my country and people I will defend.

We look to Ukraine and Russia; we reflect on Palestine and Israel; and we learn from the suffering of World War II. I ask the world, and innocent Jews, to please give Americans the space they need to mourn and learn, for Americans are still very innocent and awakening to these understandings. We are all still working on our language and communication skills.

I ask the American people to take time to rest, to take space from social media, and from others who may be harmful or cruel. I ask that Americans make appropriate legal considerations moving forward to end repeating patterns of violence that occur within religion and the Jewish faith, for these harms are too profound to ignore.

These are grave, manipulative, modern slavery and child predatory harms, and they should be addressed without aggravated blame shifting or gaslighting politics. If these harms continue to go unaddressed, our worst fears lie ahead. Our trajectory, as it stands, is already heart breaking.

We know our American soul. I ask Americans not to forget it as we continue working through these serious challenges and reflect on our shared humanity. Never forget the USA and what it once was before the grip of modern slavery and territorial war. Please remember our American spirit and culture. May Americans be safe and free.
