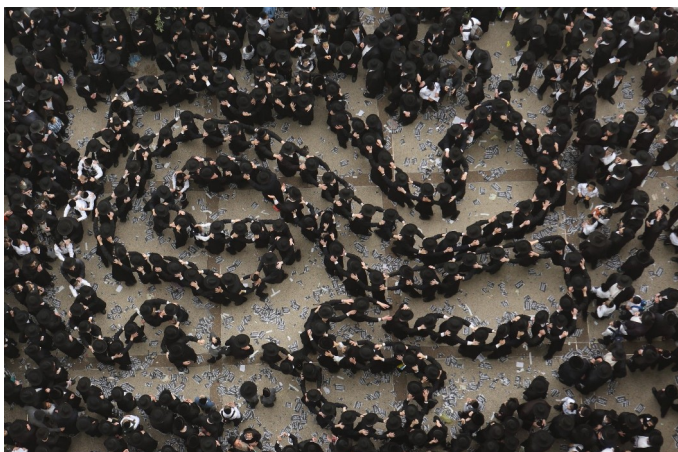
- Names of Importance: Eric Dietz Goldberg, grew up in Jewish household, advocates veganism, assisted suicide, and eugenics or "anti-natalism." Stop Having Kids campaign founded out of Portland, Oregon in January 2021 by Goldberg during Covid Pandemic. Advocates were wearing Stop Having Kids masks. Covid pandemic years, 2019-2023. In 1980, Portland, Oregon was 92.3% white. Today, Portland, Oregon is 67% white. Eric was raised to be Jewish, however later became atheist. Antinatalism and suicidal promotion is often advocated together, even to children. Advocates call it the "right to die," or "peaceful goodbyes." Anti-natalists may also advocate for "human extinction."
- The symbol for "antinatalism:" a snake consuming itself around an "A." Reminds of three other symbols: 1. The Jewish political snake, 2. The Jewish symbol for satanism, 3. The suffering caused by activism. The symbol may also remind of the "A" for "Aryanism."
- Revenge, purity, pornography and eugenics: Please review article above regarding 1930s eugenics movements by Jewish men. Filming women against their will is a theme throughout Jewish history.
- AIPAC's biggest contributor is Jewish pornography site owner. History of Jews in pornography. Cyberwars and wars throughout history, use of sexual torment and forced prostitution or pornography. Sites sued for human trafficking.
- Women have endured otherworldly harm by the hands of evil spirited people in the political activist movements.
- Word "gentrified," invented by Ruth Glass in 1960s. Ruth Glass was a German Jewish woman living in London.

- Individuals targeted by the eugenics movement and considered "victims" were those deemed by eugenicists as unfit to procreate or participate fully in society. Who were disproportionately affected? People with disabilities: This included individuals with psychiatric diagnoses, physical and intellectual disabilities. Minorities: Latinx, Native Americans, and African Americans were disproportionately targeted. Individuals deemed "socially undesirable": This encompassed those who were incarcerated, considered sexually deviant, poor, or those displaying traits like "feble-mindedness". How did the eugenic movement harm its victims? Forced sterilization: Many individuals were subjected to involuntary sterilization programs designed to prevent them from having children. Social exclusion and segregation: Eugenicists promoted the idea of isolating those they considered "unfit" from society. Trauma and emotional distress: Victims experienced deep emotional pain and loss due to forced sterilization and the societal stigma associated with being targeted by eugenics. Examples of victims and their stories: The Relf sisters: Minnie Lee and Mary Alice Relf, young African-American girls with intellectual disabilities, were sterilized against their will in 1973. Elaine Riddick: A young girl sterilized without her informed consent after giving birth, who described the experience as a violation and "rape by the state of North Carolina". Charles Holt: Institutionalized as a teenager, he was promised release if he agreed to sterilization. Efforts for redress and acknowledgment: State-level compensation programs: Some states, like North Carolina and Virginia, have approved compensation packages for surviving victims of forced sterilization. Public acknowledgment of historical injustices: Efforts are being made to shed light on the dark history of eugenics and its impact on victims. Note: The eugenics movement and its practices were deeply flawed and rooted in discrimination.

- Selective compassion, also known as selective empathy, refers to the tendency to feel compassion or empathy for some people or groups while neglecting or withholding it from others. This bias can be influenced by various factors, including personal experiences, media consumption, and perceived moral character of the individuals involved. Here's a more detailed explanation: What it is: Selective compassion involves focusing empathy and compassion on certain individuals or groups, often those who are perceived as similar, deserving, or within one's own social circle. This can lead to a lack of empathy for those outside of that group, even if they are facing similar or greater suffering. Examples: Family and friends: Individuals may show more compassion for family members or close friends than for strangers or those they perceive as different. Shared experiences: People might empathize more with those who have experienced similar hardships or challenges in their own lives. Perceived moral character: Individuals may feel more compassion for those they deem morally upright or deserving of help. Cultural and social biases: Selective compassion can be influenced by cultural norms, social identities, and media portrayals, leading to biases in who we empathize with. Why it happens: Cognitive biases: Our brains naturally categorize and group people, and this can lead to favoring those we perceive as similar or belonging to our group. Emotional regulation: Sometimes, it's emotionally easier to empathize with those we know or those who are similar to us, as it can be overwhelming to feel the suffering of everyone. Media influence: The media often focuses on certain tragedies or groups, potentially shaping our empathy towards those specific situations or populations. Consequences: Perpetuating inequality: Selective compassion can contribute to social inequalities by overlooking the suffering of marginalized or vulnerable groups.

- Attacks on white farmers in South Africa surge after "kill the boer" song.
- Very painful and heart-breaking reading of culture "costs," and population declines of Caucasians and hostile instrumental migrations by foreign enemies; In as little as 40 years white population declining to minority.
- Pandemic, hostile migrations, cyberwars, pornography wars, eugenics, Palestine and bizarre campaigns.
- New waves of activism came to light; Black Israelites, Muslim communities, the claim that the United State is Mexico, exponential increase of human trafficking movements, and other activism such as the Stop Having Kids campaign.
- Democratic and extreme left participate in reactionary naziism. Gang stalking and other violences including murder. Many leave movement for personal safety.
- Americans experienced hate crimes, slavery, warfare, eugenics and other violences.
- Black and Jewish supremacy and eugenocide movements. Historical movements of "revenge."
- Iraqi Jews resemble Palestinians, wearing similar black and white head scarfs.
