Example 1

US-AZ-A60-L4

- 60 = Murder
- L4 = Level 4 Severity

Interpretation:

Murder offense occurring under Arizona jurisdiction classified as a Level 4 severe crime.

Check fraud offense under Ontario jurisdiction classified as a Level 2 offense.

Example 3**UK-LND-H20-L3**

- UK = United Kingdom
- LND = London
- H = Cyber and Technology Crimes
- 20 = Ransomware Deployment
- L3 = Serious Felony Classification

Interpretation:

Cyber ransomware offense classified within London jurisdiction.
