

Normalized Prostitution: Lost God, Lost Light, Lost the Plot

It is an entitlement to alter an existing culture in order to create an entirely new one, one that tolerates radicalism, evil, and harm against human beings.

Union of Saints does not stand with Governor Janet Mills or supporters who claim that “sex work is work.” We believe this position creates an open sore in our state, paving the way for prostitution, commercial sexual exploitation, and human trafficking to become normalized. Normal society does not participate in prostitution. Prostitution is corruption.

The “sex work” movement promotes the belief that individuals are entitled to sell sexual access and sexual materials, including used underwear and other distasteful items. Union of Saints considers this movement degrading, harmful, and contrary to human dignity and natural law. We reject the normalization of commercial sexual exploitation in Maine.

Governor Mills also established an **Office of New Americans**, advancing policies intended to attract and integrate immigrants into Maine’s “workforce” and communities. Union of Saints believes that large scale migration and rapid demographic change can cost Mainers more than many realize. The cost may be measured through the loss of history, tradition, heritage, community identity, and spirit.

Policies that encourage legalized crime, prostitution, rapid demographic transformation without adequate public consent, limits, or safeguards may contribute to the type of social destabilization associated with Fourth Generation Warfare. Maine’s people should have an honest voice in deciding the future character, population, and direction of their state.
