I am grateful to all involved in keeping our community safe and to the local companies carrying out these programs. I apologize to anyone affected by my stance, but where my business and health are impacted, I must take a firm position against the spray.

D. Cowdrey's political, legal, and rights-based position is that the spray crosses clear health and safety boundaries. I believe financial considerations are overriding both logical and health-based reasoning. I am neither a physician nor an attorney, but I speak as a health professional, legal professional, and disabled veteran experiencing *severe* daily symptoms from the spray.

This reflects both my personal and professional opinion, as well as my case analysis.

1. Legal and Regulatory Framework

• 1991 ADA & Rehabilitation Act (Section 504):

Reference both federal disability protections and reasonable accommodation rights when reporting chemical exposure or environmental health concerns.

Fair Housing Act:

Cited under 42 U.S.C. §3601 et seq. for discrimination based on disability or environmental harm caused by community or government actions.

• Rehabilitation Act, Section 705:

Relevant for cases involving federal entities, contractors, or federally funded programs.

Equitable Housing Enforcement:

Emphasize the requirement for equal access to safe housing environments without chemical interference.

3. Process Notes

- Document all exposure-related symptoms, communications with agencies, and requests for relief (e.g., suspension of mosquito spraying).
- Request reasonable accommodation for chemical sensitivity or respiratory impairment.
- Maintain both federal and state case filings to preserve rights under overlapping jurisdictions.
- Pursue mediation before escalation to federal litigation.
- Note that federal and state entities may share jurisdiction depending on housing source and funding (federal vs. local).

4. Follow-Up Steps

- 1. File HUD complaint (disability and environmental safety).
- 2. File FCHR complaint (state-level housing discrimination).
- 3. Contact Disability Rights Florida for ADA and public health impact support.
- 4. Keep documentation organized by date, agency, and subject (health, housing, federal contact, etc.).
- 5. Reference Rehabilitation Act Section 504 and Fair Housing Act explicitly in filings.
- 6. Follow up with Human Relations / Mediation Division to ensure enforcement timelines.
