Reflection:

Once we understand modern slavery and societal slavery, it becomes more evident the direction we should head. I support robust change in our current political dynamics that works to aid Americans. It is very clear that the American people have been exploited, and often this is supported by the Democratic Party.

The propaganda within the Democratic Party betrays; it works to portray the average American native as dark, evil, selfish, and even racist. It harms, in general, a good, hardworking American citizen, who is often left behind, as strategy today is seemingly mostly geared toward “one exclusionary race,” the Black race or “BAME.” This is the new direction for the Democratic Party.

A free radical party, there is little direction for national security and keeping our people safe, but rather support of gangs, cartels, mafia, and street war.

This is, quite frankly, the opposite direction of our state and people, who require peace and stability. Now that the curtain has been pulled back and we can see the issues more clearly, we understand where our vulnerabilities are. It is clear that the Democratic Party is fighting for criminals more than for healthy, hardworking American citizens.

Even more evident is the blame-shifting and the ugliness within our society that has revealed itself in many forms; tormenting, enslaving, punishing, torturing, cold war, cruelty, harm, and a sea of radical false propaganda. The Democratic Party itself has, in this view, become a national security risk.

Worse, through the amplification of social media voices and the algorithms that perpetuate hate, along with the intensifying of personal voice through darker and more extreme behaviors, free speech has evolved into genocidal speech, in which threats of torture and death have become normalized. This type of speech not only suppresses dialogue, but acts as a violent threat against it. We witness political assassinations and, today, the celebration of them.

Furthermore, with the rise of multipolar cultures within the United States, rather than support for classic American values, Americans are being sideswiped by radical new politics from those who do not seek to support them, but instead form subcultural enclaves that are increasingly hostile and pose real threats of terrorism. Racism against white Americans is largely prevalent today, and it is clear that what was once known as the “clan” has changed its color.

Not only is hostility organized, but it expresses through paramilitary behavior; guns are openly displayed as “protest art.” Slavery remains largely unrecognized by the Democratic Party, and this may be because modern forms of slavery are not black and white. Criminal victimization is experienced across communities, including Black and Hispanic populations, and young girls within these groups are targeted at a significant scale, a criminal succession.

Furthermore, I move to recognize society’s pain at large, where Americans in general have been repeatedly targeted. For the average person, a life marked by violence and abuse has too often been the reality. We must call out abuse where it exists, because in silence, reality and history become distorted, rewritten, and lost.

Today, we recognize that exploitation exists across multiple groups. We recognize the suffering of men. We recognize the suffering of women. We see the conflict and the harm that Americans are facing today.

And we fight. Through law and spirit, we fight.
