Union of Saints believes in border security as a measure of peace for the safety of both native-born citizens and immigrants. At the same time, we remain sensitive to the journeys of families who are fleeing their home countries in search of greater safety and stability. As Americans, we are proud of our nation's long tradition of welcoming immigrants. However, we do not believe that this is the right time for large-scale migration to the United States or Canada. Our nations are facing significant challenges involving terrorism, smuggling, human trafficking, fraud, and other forms of organized crime. We believe these pressures place substantial burdens on our communities, particularly on public servants who face increasing demands and risks while serving the public.

For these reasons, we strive to balance compassion with public safety. We support the immigration enforcement policies of both the United States and Canada. While these decisions are difficult, we believe they are intended to safeguard the public during a period of heightened security concerns and rapid demographic and cultural change, which can place considerable strain on local communities and public institutions.

Other countries, such as Spain, continue to offer legal pathways or regularization programs for certain undocumented migrants. Even so, we recognize that many countries in Europe are also debating the effects of irregular migration on public services, housing, social cohesion, and local communities. We believe every nation has both the right and the responsibility to determine its own immigration policies while balancing humanitarian considerations with public safety and the well-being of its citizens and lawful residents.
