Clarification Statement

We are not all immigrants, and Americans need to make that clear. There is a difference between an American, an immigrant, and a first-generation or even second-generation immigrant. This clarification is important, especially as pro-foreign activist campaigns mirror war against **the American people**, our way of life, and our culture.

Clarifying these distinctions helps us to weed through the gross crimes committed against the people we love.

This statement serves as a moral line in the sand, but also as a moral bridge.

Blurring the lines is the same as blurring our borders—and blurring our American boundaries.
