ACLU Far Left Extremists Power Grabbing Maine's Role in Immigration Policy and Mass Migration in New England – *They Are Not The Voice of New England*

The ACLU of Maine is playing an active role in shaping Maine's response to federal immigration enforcement. Its current "ICE Out of Maine" campaign advocates for restrictions on cooperation between state and local institutions and federal immigration authorities and supports laws limiting immigration enforcement activities in Maine.

In 2026, three "ICE Out of Maine" laws took effect. These laws restrict cooperation between Maine law enforcement and federal immigration authorities, establish restrictions concerning immigration-related information held by landlords, and provide protections involving immigration enforcement at public schools, libraries, and state healthcare facilities.

The ACLU of Maine has also undertaken litigation, public-records investigations, advocacy, and administrative claims concerning federal immigration enforcement. The organization reports that it filed five administrative claims involving alleged abuses by federal immigration agents in Maine, as part of a larger nationwide ACLU effort.

Edited: These activities make the ACLU of Maine an important organization to examine when studying the political, legal, and institutional forces influencing immigration policy in New England. These policies constitute deliberate demographic replacement, instrumental migration, genocide, and Holocaust.

Holocaust Defined: A large-scale *destruction*, slaughter, or mass killing of people, especially one involving systematic or catastrophic violence.

These campaigners are keeping Mainers from protecting themselves from active territorial invasion, modern slavery, and *war*. They are a modern Holocaust shaped as a proxy lawfare front. It hurts us to express this truth, but it is a truth that cannot be denied. They are not joined by small fronts, but by a mass taxpayer exploited war front that is actively operating against and targeting the American people and their right to safety, sovereignty, culture, heritage, freedom and territory.

It hurts. It cuts into the heart of our culture. Modern Americans have never known a hurt this severe.

Destruction Defined: Major ways cultures can be destroyed or severely diminished

1. Physical destruction of the population

- Mass killing, genocide, or other forms of large-scale violence can eliminate the people who carry a culture.

- This is the most extreme form of cultural destruction.

2. Forced displacement

- Expelling a population from its traditional homeland can disrupt communities, institutions, traditions, and relationships to place.
- Over generations, displacement can contribute to cultural assimilation.

3. Forced assimilation

- Authorities may prohibit or discourage a language, religion, dress, customs, names, or traditional practices.
- Historical examples include forced schooling or policies designed to make minority populations adopt the dominant culture.

4. Suppression of language

- If children stop learning their community's language, cultural knowledge can disappear rapidly.
- Language often carries stories, concepts, traditions, and historical memory that are difficult to reproduce through translation.

5. Destruction or appropriation of cultural heritage

- Destroying sacred sites, monuments, archives, artifacts, books, or historical records can sever connections with the past.
- Cultural property can also be removed or appropriated.

6. Disruption of family and community transmission

- Separating children from parents or communities can interrupt the normal transmission of traditions, values, stories, and skills.
- This can be particularly consequential when sustained across generations.

7. Economic displacement

- Loss of land, employment, housing, or economic institutions can make it difficult for a community to maintain traditional ways of life.

8. Demographic transformation

- Large population movements can change the demographic composition of an area. It can contribute to cultural change when combined with displacement, assimilation, institutional exclusion, or loss of cultural transmission.

9. Institutional replacement

- Schools, religious institutions, government structures, media, and community organizations may gradually replace local cultural institutions with those of another culture.

10. Stigmatization and discrimination

- If people are repeatedly taught that their language, identity, traditions, or customs are inferior or unacceptable, they may stop passing them to their children.

11. Loss of historical memory

- Suppressing records, rewriting history, destroying archives, or preventing communities from teaching their history can weaken collective identity.
