25. Exponential taxpayer costs.

26. Discrimination against native students and workers.
27. Native isolationism.
28. Eugenics campaigns and native population control.
29. Celebration of accelerated changes, including rapid population shifts.
30. Signs of “threat” in everyday interactions.
31. Organ trafficking, body-part trafficking, and medical trafficking.
32. “Hot shots” and poisonous medicine.
33. Universities used for exploitative measures.
34. Identity theft, fake birth certificates, stolen “native spirit,” and replacement.
35. Fewer native workers visible; more foreign workers.
36. Cultural norms shift; a different social energy toward native people emerges.
37. Retaliation against natives for measures that support cultural preservation.
38. Hostility toward normal national identity.
39. Aggression toward native racial groups and genocidal-level forced diaspora rhetoric.
40. Retelling or distortion of history and modern truths.
41. Harmful or racist daily rhetoric against native culture.
42. Activism through “war art” and anti-native political propaganda.
43. New foreign businesses with no native workers.
44. Illicit foreign businesses and underground criminal networks.
45. Crime rings expanding and blending into the mainstream.
46. Increasing street crime and daily targeting, sabotage of vulnerable natives.
