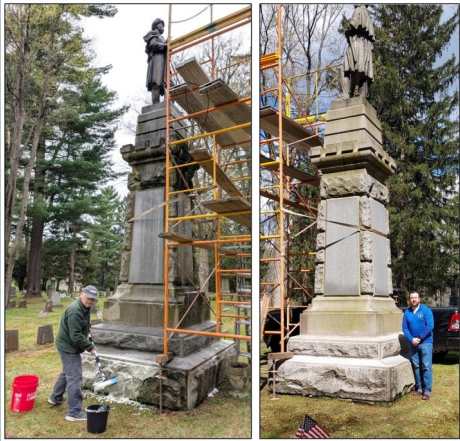

The American Civil War....

was one of the country's bloodiest and most gruesome wars ever fought.

It was more than northern states fighting southern states. It was more than states rights, slavery, and domination of individual beliefs and opinions. It was brother against brother, friend against friend.

Over 600,000 Americans lost their lives during the years between 1861 and 1865. Families were changed forever.

Over 500 men either volunteered or were drafted from the Town of Hornells-ville and City of Hornell. Over 140 of those men were killed in action, died in service, wounded in action, became disabled, were prisoners of war or missing in action.
