Women of the ELCA at Sardis have chosen BeLoved Asheville to receive and distribute the Christmas toys for the Western North Carolina area. Abiding Savior Lutheran in Fairview, NC regularly collects toys each fall to donate to BeLoved Asheville, and Rev. David Eck highly endorsed this program.

We are encouraged to purchase dolls and books that are representative of BIPOC families. That is, Black, Indigenous, and People of Color. Pastor Dave says that there is a large Latino population present in the Asheville community, along with indigenous, black, and biracial families. PLEASE DO NOT WRAP GIFTS. It will be easier for them to sort by age and gender.

How does BeLoved Asheville serve Youth and Kids? From their website:

Whether it is sharing computers, internet, or other tools to help youth succeed in school, or giving equity tickets to families for enriching cultural events including plays, concerts, performances; providing in-home libraries and community libraries, or educational STEM toys; or providing scholarships to camp; connecting kids and families to the arts and cultural events in our community, we are increasing opportunities for kids to grow to their full potential. We share Wings for Kids bags during the summer which support summer enrichment and learning. They contain educational materials, books, small toys, and arts and crafts supplies.

We partner with local schools in their work to close the racial achievement and opportunity gaps through providing resources that kids need to thrive in school. We also host educational events like

Constitutional Rights to education for parents of students who are facing opportunity gaps. We host regular neighborhood and community Kids Days helping kids to make positive memories through games, music, cultural



events and more. We share diapers, school supplies, school bus stop kits for winter, and toys at the holidays. We also provide educational opportunities through the schools teaching classes about important issues our community is facing and how kids and youth can be a part of the solution. And we provide a myriad of ways for kids and youth to engage in community service projects to use their gifts to make a difference.

Should there be no scholarship applicants for any given year; a contribution may be made for educational loans previously accrued by the currently serving Sardis Pastor or other person serving at Sardis. Every effort should be made to award this scholarship fund to an individual or individuals. Special circumstances could allow an application from a rostered person not currently serving at Sardis if no applications have been received by current students or the persons mentioned above.

Ken motioned to accept these changes, Joe seconded and the motion carried. Dwayne will present it to the Scholarship Committee.

New Business

Dwayne presented the proposed 2025 Spending Plan to council. The Finance Committee motioned to accept the 2025 Spending Plan, seconded by Jon, and the motion carried. It will be given to the Congregation on November 3rd and voted on November 17th.

Dwayne discussed with council, the Ronnie Weaver Estate monies left to Sardis. The Finance Committed motioned that \$25,000 go into the Parsonage Fund and \$544.95, the balance, be put into the Memorial Fund to honor Ronnie at a later date. Joe seconded and the motion carried.

The disaster monies collected is \$12,177.00. Jane motioned to send the monies to the NC Synod Disaster Relief Fund, Ken seconded and the motion carried. This fund allows the monies to be used to the NC Disaster Fund only. Other discussions were:

Rick announced the next Sardis Blood Drive will be December 2nd, 2pm – 5pm.

The next Council Meeting is scheduled for November 10, at 7PM.
