### EASTER - THE FEAST OF THE RESURRECTION OF OUR LORD

Easter is the climax of the Church Year. The Gospels state that our Lord Jesus rose from the dead on "the first day of the week." This day of the week became "the Lord's Day." On Easter Day, and every Sunday we gather in joyful remembrance of His victory. Throughout the solemn weeks of Lent the Church looked forward eagerly, almost impatiently, for the coming of Easter.

In Romans 6 St. Paul argues "Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death? Therefore we have been buried with Him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life. For if we have been united with Him in a death like His, we will certainly be united with Him in a resurrection like His." At Christmas all attention is focused on the historical fact of our Lord's birth, in which we cannot participate. St. Paul tells us, however, that we may participate in Christ's death and resurrection. Easter is the feast of our redemption and to be redeemed means not only are we freed from sin. It means also that we are endowed with grace. The life in grace is the great theme and lesson of Easter. In the early Church the new Christians were baptized on Easter Day, and they became living illustrations of the grace of Holy Baptism. St. Paul also wrote in Colossians 2:12-13, "When you were buried with Him in baptism, you were also raised with Him through faith in the power of God, who raised Him from the dead. And when you were dead in trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made you alive together with Him, when He forgave us all our trespasses."

In ancient days the celebration of Easter began at midnight with the ringing of church bells. The churches were ablaze with candles and lights. Baptism was administered at "cockcrow." The newly baptized were dressed in white robes, reminding them of the "clean, linen shroud" in which Joseph of Arimathea wrapped the body of our Lord and signified "we were buried with Him by baptism into death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too, might walk in newness of life."

The victory is won. The entire season of Lent reminded us of the battle of darkness with Light. The Light seemed to be overcome when Christ died on the Cross. But at Christmas the light shone in the darkness. So after the sorrowful Holy Week the sun of the Resurrection rises victoriously to shine eternally.

Have a blessed Easter season.

Sardis Lutheran Church Council Minutes February 6, 2022

Gene Biggerstaff called the meeting to order, Kathy Weaver had devotions.

Kathy read the minutes from the December meeting. Kristin Teague made a motion to accept the minutes as read, Bryan Hood seconded, and the motion passed.

Gene presented the treasurer's reports. The Building Fund as of January 31<sup>st</sup> had a balance of \$7,363.60, the Cemetery Fund \$1,159.83 and the General Fund \$6,689.70. Jon Gladden made a motion to accept the report as presented, Mike Midgett seconded, and the Treasurer's Report was accepted.

Pastor's Report

I want to express my thanks to the Council and members for your assistance as I began my service at Sardis. I'm still trying to get to know the folks at Sardis. If I get names mixed up please correct me so that I will be able to call you by name.

LENTEN SERVICES – As in the past, Sardis will join three other congregations in the Sunday night Lenten services (St. Paul's Lutheran, Old St. Paul's Lutheran, and Beth Eden Lutheran). The pastors will rotate churches as has been done in past years. A theme is being worked out with a possible booklet on the theme for congregational members. Our Worship and Music Committee has suggested the time as in other years (7:00 pm) with no dinner before to avoid the danger of COVID. Complete information about Lenten services will be provided in the March newsletter.

I continue to work in the pastor's office Monday through Wednesday. Other work I do at home to have use of my computer and printer. However, you can connect with me anytime by phone – home 828-464-4999 or cell phone 828-461-3838 or by email at hollarw@bellsouth.net.

### Pastor Bill Hollar

The booklet mentioned (devotions for Lent) will be ordered (1 per family) with a cost of \$1 each. This cost will come out of the Worship & Music Committee budget.

#### Old Business:

Covid Committee: After a parishioner voiced concern on the distribution of communion the committee decided to reduce the number of people in line. Beginning at the next communion service it was decided to have only on side of the Sanctuary at a time to be in line. An usher will still direct the communion recipients. The Pastor will distribute the bread and the Assisting Minister will distribute the wine.

Annual Meeting: Reports will be distributed immediately after the service. Gene will point out any main points, take questions and will ask if any committee chairperson would like to speak.

Fellowship Hall: Terry Bledsoe will get the unused tables moved and begin the Pastor's Display. The funds set aside for the display materials will be used to buy storage containers for the Chrismon's. Another round of cleaning may produce additional items that can be used elsewhere.

Playground Equipment Replacement: Insurance has provided \$14,000 with a quote of \$11,500 for the replacement cost. The Property Committee brings a motion that we do this. After a vote the motion was approved. There was also two other items the committee introduced - \$1100 to patch the pavement and \$1000 for mulch replacement if needed.

#### New Business:

Security cameras: There have been two estimates given so far with Terry Bledsoe meeting with both company representatives and providing input. We are still waiting on an estimate from the second company.

Safe Gatherings: The Synod requires background screenings every 3 years for anyone who cares for or works with the children of the church. We currently have an estimate of 14 church members who would need to be screened, with a cost of \$35 with each screening. Gene will seek further information on requirements, timing and need.

Side Door: During the annual meeting Ken Propst brought up the need to verify the closure of the side door of the Sanctuary. Several times it has been found open after the service even though it looks shut. Mike will check with Ken about the possible need for repairs to the doors.

Pew Cushions: April Fulbright mentioned the fading of the pew cushions, especially the side mostly in the sun. This will be considered but is not currently a high priority.

With no further business, Jon made a motion to adjourn. The meeting ended with the Lord's Prayer.

The next meeting will be March 13<sup>th</sup> at 6pm, due to the Lenten Service at 7pm.
