Sardis goes to the ELCA National Youth Gathering 2024.

The theme of this year's National Youth Gathering was "Created To Be." This would be the first ELCA National Youth Gathering since 2017 due to the pandemic in 2020. The gathering was pushed back to 2021 but again, the realities of Covid forced another cancellation. The plans were for the gathering to be in Minneapolis Minnesota. But, after the two failed attempts a new plan, director, and location brought us back to New Orleans. We had a Gathering of 16,000 youth not only from across the country but from other countries as well. We had youth participants from the Bahamas, the Caribbean, Asia, and Canada in attendance.

It was a Holy experience of worship, fellowship, service, and learning for all who attended. Our group from Sardis was composed of all first-time attendees. And we learned a lot, grew together, and bonded with new friends from Old St. Paul Lutheran in Conover and the many other Lutheran congregations we would meet, worship with, and serve alongside in our mission work opportunities the gathering provided in and to the city and people of New Orleans.

On our "accompaniment day "(faithful Christ centered service) we joined with several other church groups and worked with the Second Harvest Food bank preparing meal boxes for those experiencing food insecurity. We put our hand to good work in Christ's command to feed the hungry. We were able to build, pack, and package 1,300 meal boxes for those in need. It was truly inspiring to watch our youth rise to the challenge and step out of their comfort zones to do this Holy work.

We gathered every evening back at the Smoothie Dome for mass worship and hear inspiring speakers. This was a time for our youth to see and experience the we were created to be Authentic, Brave, Free, Disruptive, Disciples in and through the Love of Christ Jesus for the sake of the world. During the week we also gathered with our Synod and churches throughout our region with worship and fellowship. It was a region wide worship service that included music from NC and assisting ministers from across our fellow Region 9 Synods.

On Friday we had our "interactive Learning day which consisted of group activities, interactive programs that taught us about many different ministries and aspects of the greater ELCA church. There was a fun zone with games, bouncy houses, GaGa ball pits, carnival games and much more. There were booths for Lutheran colleges and the seminaries handing out information and merchandise. There was even an "Old Lutheran" store where you could buy Lutheran themed merchandise. The convention center was full of the celebration of all things Lutheran.

On our last day we gathered for worship one last time where we recapped the amazing week of being the youth of the ELCA and "Created to Be." The sermon came from our presiding bishop Elizabeth Eaton and we installed the next gathering director and celebrated the blessed, faithful, hard work of Deacon, Tammy Jones West who was this year's Gathering Director. And then together 16,000 plus in attendance participated in the sacrament of Holy Communion. It was chill-bump inducing to hear and experience our Lutheran worship and liturgy with sixteen thousand young voices praising God, reciting the Creed, and the Lord's Prayer with one voice. It was truly Holy.

In closing I want to take a moment to thank this beautiful church for supporting our youth to be able to participate and have this experience! They and I are already looking forward to the 2027 Youth Gathering in Minneapolis, Minnesota with excitement and Joy. Thank you all again. Because, without your generosity, love, and support our youth could not have been able to have this faith-full experience.

We welcome back the Reverend Denise Henry to speak at our Homecoming Service on Sunday, September 8th.

Rev. Denise was raised in SC and has been in NC since 1986 when she and her former husband, Rev. James White, was called to ministry at Sardis until 1990. She attended Columbia College for her bachelor's degree and received her Master's in Counselor Education from Lenoir Rhyne University and an Advanced Certificate in School Counseling from UNC-Greensboro. She served as a school counselor for 23 years, retiring in 2018.

Through the encouragement of the NC Women of the ELCA, as she served on the Board, she discerned the call to ordained ministry. She entered Luther Seminary in 2016 and graduated in 2021 with her Master's in Divinity. During her internship year at Mt Olive, Hickory, she discerned her calling to chaplaincy and applied to Atrium Health Wake Forest's chaplain residency program. She served as a Chaplain resident, graduating in 2022. During that time, she served as a part time interim at Christ Lutheran in Jonesville.

Rev. Denise serves as Chaplain for Lutheran Services Carolinas - Forsyth Campuses, specifically Trinity Elms Senior Care Community in Clemmons and Trinity Glen Senior Care Community in Winston-Salem. She has been there since January 2023 and was ordained on February 11, 2023.

Bear witness to wonder. pay Attention and be Astonished and Amazed! Marry your life to amazement.


