Epiphany – The Manifestation of Our Lord

We are now in the Epiphany season, the weeks between Christmas and Lent. Since at least the Fourth Century this has been a time in which the Church has shown the manifestation of Jesus as the Christ. God the Father's acknowledgement of the human Christ of God's only begotten Son and the anointing with the power from on high are the chief thoughts of this season.

At Christmas we commemorate a historical event, the Birth of Jesus. People rejoice over the fact that the Savior is born. Epiphany, however, commemorates that the Christ who was born in Bethlehem is recognized by the world. Jesus was manifested as God, and the world recognizes Him as God. The relation of the Nativity and Epiphany is that at Christmas God appears before the world as a human being and at Epiphany this man appears before the world as God. The Gospel of John links the two festive events, ""The Word became flesh and lived among us, full of grace and truth (Christmas); we have beheld His glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father (Epiphany)."

The Epiphany reveals to the world that the man Jesus is God. How could the man born in Bethlehem show that He is God? Only by signs and wonders. All His miracles point out to the world that Jesus is God. His whole life is an Epiphany, a manifestation of Himself as God before the world. St. John lists the "signs" of Jesus as the promised Messiah, as we saw several weeks ago in the changing of water into wine at the wedding in Cana of Galilee. The Epiphany season begins and ends with God the Father declaring of Jesus, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased." The Gospel lessons for this season give us new manifestations of Christ's character Sunday by Sunday.

The Epiphany season ends with Jesus leading three of His disciples up a mountain where He is transfigured. From that moment, Jesus goes back down the mountain, and we begin the Lenten season with Jesus on another mountain where He overcomes three temptations of Satan.

I encourage you during the Sundays of the Epiphany season to contemplate this as we are led deeper into our faith in Christ. I would be happy to discuss any of this with you.

Now I want to change the subject. Some of you have asked about my family. I lost my wife, Carol, after 57 years of marriage, with her death a year ago in January. I continue to miss her, but am comforted by the words of our Lord Jesus and His promise of the Resurrection. We have four children: Dawn who with her family lives in Charlotte; David, who with his family lives in Washington, DC; Jeff, who with his wife live in Reading, PA; and Mike, who with his family live in Washington, DC. We have seven grandchildren, two in college; one working in Arizona; one working in Pittsburg; and three who will finish high school in Washington this Spring.

During our time together, I hope to get to know you better. Feel free to contact me if I, as a pastor, can be of service to you.

Old Business:

Mask Wearing and Sunday Offering collection: It was brought to the attention of the council about some concerns of passing the offering plates. Terry Bledsoe made a motion to return to the collection basket in the Narthex, Bryan Hood seconded, and the motion passed. After some discussion it was decided to keep the mask wearing decision as "strongly recommended" in place, with each parishioner making their own decision.

Use of the Fellowship Hall: With an increase in requests to use the hall, a suggestion was made to have some criteria on how, when, and who might use the hall especially during the covid restrictions. Gene Biggerstaff made a notion to create a sub-committee to study and create those criteria so a standard will be established. Kathy seconded the motion and the motion passed. Hopefully the sub-committee will be presented at the next council meeting.

New Business: none brought up

Mission and Goals

Outdoor Worship Area: Tim Whitener – the Land Use Committee and the Property Committee have met and are looking at funding the potential structure. Pastor Adrienne and Bruce mentioned a resource to help churches raise funds for specific projects. Mike Ward, a Synod Financial consultant, would be contacted to assess our needs and assist in finding the best way to raise funds. April Fulbright made a motion to have a Zoom meeting with Mike Ward at the January meeting, if possible, to learn more. Kathy seconded the motion and the motion passed.

Youth Ministries: April stated that the highway side classrooms have been reorganized and are now more efficient in use. She also mentioned checking ideas for the upstairs space, the storeroom in the older section, and also looking for a youth office space for Robin Stuart and Cynthia, the new youth directors. The goal is to restart youth meetings in the fall of 2022.

Technology Services: Terry and Ben Whitener are looking at a complete system update. The old and new systems are currently working well together but will eventually need to be upgraded.

Senior Citizens: no current updates

Ray Whitener (Evangelism Committee) hopes to have the Shepard's meal in March. Also, the possible need to somehow increase the ease of use of the Sardis website – at this time there are no plans for this. Lastly – election of officers for the coming year.

Jon made a motion for Gene to be Vice-chair of the Council. No further nominees and a unanimous vote later, Gene was elected. Kathy volunteered to remain as Council secretary for the next year.

Bruce thanked the leaving Council members – Terry Bledsoe, Bruce Sigman, Tim Whitener and Carolyn Hoyle and also welcomed the incoming members – Ray Whitener, Nena Babb, Kristin Teague and Roger Lutz.

With no further business the meeting ended with the Lord's Prayer.
