Those 12 days are celebratory. And we need a little Christmas, right? I think so, especially in this time of continuing pandemic. This year in the Season of Christmas, I invite you into the spiritual practice of joy as we continue to wait for the coming of our Savior.

I suggest this because it is my experience to drop the spiritual focus we take during Advent. I stop being concerned with preparation. I'm happy Christmas has come! Most of the time, my preparations for the second coming of Christ cease and I instead feel a sense of closure. I can appreciate my gifts and the holiday and move on.

But preparations continue! Remember to be ready when Christ comes! It will be a joyous and salvific day!

Bruce Sigman called the meeting to order, Mike Midgett had devotions.

Pastor Adrienne Martin introduced our interim pastor, Pastor William Hollar. He was kind enough to give us a short biography of his years in ministry, which is extensive. We also discussed duties that the Council would expect him to participate in. With approximately 20 hrs per week available of Pastor Bill's time not all of Pastor Adrienne's meetings and commitments will be able to be filled every week. Some items brought up were of course the monthly Council meeting, weekly bible study and worship & music committee meeting. He will have one Sunday off a month and will provide a Pastor's report each month for Council meeting. The Synod will assist in helping to fill the empty Sunday position. The confirmation classes will be covered by Beth Eden.

Kathy read minutes from the October 24th meeting. Jon Gladden made a motion to accept minutes as read, Mike seconded. The motion passed.

Bruce presented the October treasurer's reports. The Building Fund as of October 31st was \$7,358.06, Cemetery Fund was \$1,266.83 and General Fund balance \$7,739.74. Gene Biggerstaff made a motion to accept the reports, Bryan Hood seconded, and the motion passed.

During this pandemic, Sardis has been giving faithfully and generously. And last week, we had a family in need of urgent assistance and the response was amazing! Because of their compassion and generosity, we were able to take care of the emergency and the family is in a much better position! Thanks be to God!

Stories like this are what it looks like to be the Church. How overwhelmingly beautiful it can be! There are so many beautiful stories of the Church being the Church. It is my prayer that we continue to grow in mission, justice, and mercy for the sake of the world.

Council min. cont. Old Business:

Interim Pastor: After a discussion of Pastor Hollar and his qualifications, Jon made a motion to accept Pastor Bill as the interim during Pastor Adrienne's sabbatical. Gene seconded and the motion passed. It was suggested that a contract be written/drawn up listing the duties the Council requests and presented to Pastor Bill. Pastor Adrienne, Bruce and Dwayne Whitener will write this and talk over the expected duties with Pastor Bill.

December guidelines: The Synod still requires that masks be worn during services. After some discussion Jon made a motion that mask wearing be strongly recommended, Mike seconded, and the motion passed. We will once again start regular services using acolytes, crucifers, lay readers, ushers and assisting ministers. Communion will stay on 1st Sundays monthly and festival Sundays, with the Pastor and communion assistants wearing gloves.

New Business

Property Committee: Problems with the old septic tank near the cemetery and the outside faucet leaking was brought up. A plumber was called and the tank was pumped out, a new drain line installed and the outside faucet fixed for a total of approximately \$900.

Mission and Goals

Outdoor area: Tim Whitener – the Land Use Committee met with a contractor and are receiving quotes for grading.

Fellowship Hall: No update, April Fulbright not available.

Technology: Terry Bledsoe – no response yet on the second grant request. Pastor Adrienne will follow up on this. A new DVD recorder will be purchased if the funds are received.

Senior Citizens: Susan Weaver reported that the Blessing Box has been installed, filled with groceries and is being used. It was reported that the box has been filled several times and that a local grocery store, Honey's, has provided groceries to be used to fill the box.

With no further business Jon made a motion to adjourn. The meeting ended with the Lord's Prayer.
