#### **OUR LENTEN OBSERVANCE**

On Ash Wednesday, March 2, we begin our observance of the forty days of the holy season of Lent. Probably the Lenten season had its origin during the days of the early church, in the desire to continue in the lives of the faithful followers of Christ, the sorrow and mourning experienced by the disciples during the hours when their Lord was crucified and lay in the grave. This sorrow was turned into joy when He was returned to them by the Resurrection.

St. Paul wrote in his letter to the Romans, "Therefore we have been buried with Him by Baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we, too, might walk in newness of life." The basic purpose of Lent is the preparation for the rising to newness of life at Easter. All Lenten observances aim at permanent improvement in the Christian. Lent is the time for practice and training in virtues and self-denial that are to be permanent and habitual in the renewed life after Easter.

We, too, are to rise with Christ at Easter and walk with Him in newness of life. In preparation, we will spend the coming weeks in examining our lives to discover attitudes, practices, and habits which do not fit with the new life into which we have been born by Holy Baptism. It is a time of penitence, of putting out of our lives all that remains of the old life or has crept in once more. But it is also a time of special prayer, for without the help of the Holy Spirit nothing will be accomplished in us.

Therefore we add additional worship services during Lent beginning on Ash Wednesday. Each Sunday night between Ash Wednesday and Palm Sunday we will gather for special services to reflect on all of this. This year, four congregations with join in a series of services entitled, "IN VIEW OF GOD'S MERCY," based on the theme verse, "*Return to the Lord, your God, for He is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love.*" (Joel 2:13) The pastors will rotate between the congregations each week.

The pastors and churches participating are Andrew Miller (Old St. Paul's Lutheran Church), Marcus Ollis (Beth Eden Lutheran Church), Ralph Kraft (St. Paul's Lutheran Church), Bill Hollar (Sardis Lutheran Church), and on the last Sunday in Lent Adrienne Martin. The services at Sardis begin at 7:00 pm. See announcement elsewhere in this newsletter for more details.

I hope you will plan to join with us each Sunday during Lent.

### Social Ministry Collections for Outreach in our Community, State and World

During Lent and Easter, the Social Ministry Committee has three projects to reach out to those in need. The first will be a project for our community. In March, the committee will purchase non-perishable items and prepare bag lunches for the Homeless Soup Kitchen. The Soup Kitchens are not open on weekends, so donations of bag lunches are needed to share with the homeless to help them through the weekend.

The second project is a global project. It is the collection of items for Personal Care Items When families find their homes destroyed, or must flee for safety, soap and a towel rarely make the cut for what they can carry. Arriving in a refugee camp or other place of safety, they are scared, vulnerable and dirty from the travel. The simple items included in a personal care kit provide much needed self-care, critical germ fighting and the chance to regain dignity amidst situations of fear and uncertainly.

Items need for the kits are:

One light-weight towel (20" x 40" to 52" X 27") dark colors recommended Two or three bath size bars of soap in original wrapping One adult size toothbrush in original wrapping One sturdy comb One metal nail clipper

The Social Ministry Committee will collect these in March and April and send to Lutheran World Relief for distribution.

If you prefer, you can donate \$7.00and members of the committee will purchase these items. The final project for this committee during March and April is a new project for the Lutheran Services of the Carolinas and Sardis. The committee will be collecting items for hygiene kits for New Americans. Different church communities will be receiving new Americans during the next three months. Asheville is expecting 100 and Raleigh is expecting 220+. The Social Ministry Committee will be collecting the following items and making kits for the Lutheran Services of the Carolinas to distribute.

Items needed for the adult kits are: Regular sized toothpaste Toothbrush Soap Shampoo Items needed for the child kits are: Children's toothpaste Children's toothbrush Children's shampoo Body wash

#### COUNCIL NEWS

Sardis Lutheran Church Council Minutes January 9, 2022

Members Present: Pastor Bill Hollar, Gene, Susan, Kathy, Ben, Jon, Mike, Ray, Roger, Nena, Kristin April

Gene Biggerstaff called the meeting to order, Ray Whitener had devotions.

Kathy Weaver read the minutes from the December meeting. April Fulbright made a motion to accept the minutes as read, Nena Babb seconded, and the motion passed.

Gene presented the treasurer's reports. The Building Fund as of December 31<sup>st</sup> had a balance of \$7,670.62, the Cemetery Fund \$1,159.83 and the General Fund \$12,533.65. Kathy made a motion to accept the reports as presented, Susan Jones seconded, and the motion was approved.

Pastor's Report

Since I have just began my service with you, having been on the job one week, I don't have a lot to report yet. It is an honor to serve among you at Sardis Lutheran Church while Pastor Adrienne is on Sabbatical. I have started getting to know the members of the congregation and how you carry out your mission.

During the past week I have been involved in the following ways.

In the church office Tuesday and Wednesday, 9am to 1 pm;

Phone contacts with 7 shut-ins. The purpose was to introduce myself and check on each person. I would like to follow up with an in person visit if conditions and the person permits a visit. Pastor Adrienne left me a list of people on whom I should make visits and I plan to begin contacting them this week.

Bible Study Tuesday morning.

Sardis Prayer Group Tuesday evening.

Fred T. Ford Seniors Group lunch and meeting at Wesley Chapel Wednesday morning.

Worship and Music Committee Thursday evening.

Attended with members of Sardis, funeral for Martha Griffin Saturday.

From my limited experience with Sardis, it appears that I should be available to the members and work at the Pastor's office Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday 9 am to 2 pm. This could change as I see what works best. I hope to make visits to shut-ins, nursing homes, hospitals, and others in the afternoon, if COVID rules permit. Otherwise, I'll continue to make visits by phone. I am also open to advice of the Council about this.

As long as it does not conflict with my work at Sardis, I am continuing to conduct Thursday morning chapel at Trinity Village as a volunteer. COVID rules still prevent local pastors from doing this volunteer service and since I am still considered staff, I can do this. The new chaplain is at Trinity Ridge on Thursdays and unavailable for this. At the same time, I will be able to visit any members or friends of Sardis who happen to be at Trinity Village.

I am looking forward to serving with you these three months. I am always open to advice and suggestions from the Council since I am new to Sardis.

#### Old Business:

Covid Committee: The Sub-committee has not yet been established. Gene will head this committee with hopefully April, Kristen Teague, Ben Whitener and Mike Midgett as members. Meeting dates will be established as soon as the committee is formalized.

Fund Raising Committee: Gene will meet with Dwayne Whitener and possibly make arrangements to meet with Mike Ward, a fund-raising advisor from the Synod.

Fellowship Hall: April reported that 2 workdays resulted in additional storage space and the need for designated areas. Items found are "youth stuff", bible school items and decorations in several areas in the church. Current Chrismons, stored in cardboard boxes need new storage containers. Some storage cabinets need to be removed and better cabinets acquired. April will put together a list of items that we may be able to get rid of. The "library" contains Sunday school items that are no longer used, and we may be able to move out. Two unused tables were also mentioned as unused. It was brought up that Terry Bledsoe could use the wooden tables to make the Pastor's display cabinets. This last will be considered and brought before the council at a later date. There were also some items gathered that will be mentioned to the Property committee to be disposed of or saved.

Outdoor Worship Area: No new updates were available

New Business:

Parking Lot Fire: A report was received from the authorities concerning the details of the fire. Insurance is yet to be filed and there are concerns about coverage. The Property Committee will get repair cost estimates and possible parking signage for the future. There is also warning tape around the damaged playground area.

Security cameras: Dwayne is getting estimates from security companies concerning adding cameras to the church's property. Ben suggested the best place to start in purchasing is to establish "what do we want?" as far as visibility, recording, etc. He will follow up with Dwayne to narrow the choices available, and the cost.

Annual Meeting: Usually held on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of February with a lunch meal after the service. After some discussion, Nena Babb made a motion to conduct the meeting immediately after the service and having no meal. April seconded and the motion passed. After the service on Feb 13<sup>th</sup> the annual reports will be handed out and discussed if there are any questions.

With no further New Business, Jon Gladden made a motion to adjourn and April seconded. The meeting adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.
