Bruce called the meeting to order, the first in-person meeting of 2021, and then had devotions. Music and Worship Committee Chairman Becky Gladden presented recommendations for reopening, including a possible time change for Easter sunrise service. A subcommittee for reopening has been formed. The recommended time for drive in Easter service was 7am and was approved. With no additional questions for Becky she was thanked for her time and left the meeting.

The meeting continued with the reading of the minutes. Jon made a motion to accept the minutes as read the motion passed.

Bruce presented the Treasurer's report for Feb 2021 – Building Fund balance \$11,208; Cemetery Fund balance \$1,437; and the General Fund balance \$10,870. Jon made a motion to accept the Treasurer's report Susan seconded and the motion was passed.

Pastor's Report:

Grace and Peace to you from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ!

This Sunday marked a year since life before the pandemic (that we knew, at least!). March 7, 2020 was our last in-person service in the sanctuary. I know this has been a difficult year and I know we are all more than ready to get back.

We really have accomplished a lot and shown the true strength of our character. The people of Sardis have been resilient, patient, faithful, and creative. Sometimes we don't know the extent of our gifts, but difficult situations often reveal them as we do our best to make the most of it. We have made progress and as I have received my first vaccination, I pray that we are all able to soon.

This Season of Lent has been full. I hope our Lenten Series has been meaningful and insightful. I have learned a lot and felt renewed by the fresh perspectives of our preachers. I was recently reminded from one of Bishop Tim's synod reflections that we are filled with love for justice because of the Good News of God's love for us in Jesus Christ. Our baptismal covenant does invite us to strive for peace and justice, however, it is faithful to remember that is our response to a loving and redeeming God.

Our Six Weeks on Money started on Ash Wednesday and has continued. We have lessons to complete and a 45-minute discussion on Tuesdays. - The request for Frank to join Sardis was presented to the Council, Jon made a motion to accept the request, Tim seconded, and the motion passed. Welcome to Frank as a Sardis member! He will be welcomed into the membership Easter Sunday.

Old Business:

Steeple – The new steeple will be delivered on March 16th and will require some help in removing from delivery trailer. Bruce volunteered his tractor service to help unload with a few additional hands needed to help steady the load when moving. Steeple Jack are scheduled to be here on Monday March 21 (tentative to their schedule) to remove the old steeple and install the new one. The insurance company will reassess at that time and possibly resubmit our claim. Several suggestions have been made on how to dispose of the old steeple, but nothing decided yet.

Painting updates – The Property Committee are looking into painting the front doors, some railing and having the siding cleaned. Currently 2 estimates are forth coming. We are hoping for a quick turnaround once a company is chosen, but it does look like a late April time frame.

Sign Update – Tim provided an update. When installing the new letters on the sign it was realized the job was not as extensive as first believed and so did not cost as much. Tim suggested the leftover funds (\$394) be given to the Tech Committee to assist in the purchase of new equipment. Jon seconded and the motion passed.

Christian Education – An upcoming meeting is being planned and hopes to meet in person. April reported that a modified Egg Hunt for the children has been planned. Instead of having something at the church a surprise will be delivered to each child’s home.

New Business:

Reopening Committee – Bruce presented a list of seven volunteers and a list of questions/suggestions for the committee to consider, along with any others they may come up with. April will be the Council contact. Kathy made a motion to accept this committee, Gene seconded, and the motion passed. No initial meeting date has been set.

- Clean Up Day – Scheduled for March 27, anyone interested in helping is welcome. It was decided to
- purchase 6 8-10 ft maples to replace trees that have been lost the past several years. Brian checked on

pricing at Hawksridge and the total would be \$486 or about \$81 each. April made a motion to purchase the new trees with a second from Brian, the motion passed. The Pastor will present an option to the congregation to possibly purchase the trees in memory/honor of someone or again using Memorial funds.

Easter Service- A change in time from 6:30 to 7am was suggested due to having time for the outside setup. Ben made a motion to accept the time change, Brian seconded, and the motion passed. Bruce will contact Joe Biggerstaff about the time and equipment usage.

With no other business Jon made a motion to adjourn. The meeting ended with the Lord's Prayer.

Music for Worship

Most of us would agree that Music is an important part of our worship experience, and I want to thank all those who have given their voices and talents to this calling during the past 14 months of pandemic pandemonium. Worship has been greatly enriched by your gifts.

As we prepare to reopen in June, many things will likely be different for a while, and music will be one of those things. Here are some ways that I hope will bring the richness of music safely into the worship space. Hopefully, some of these measures will be very temporary, but maybe, something wonderful will grow from these experiences as we come back together.

Live singing continues to be risky for gatherings, especially indoors. Because of this, hymns will need to be few and pre-recorded at least for the time being.

Wednesday evenings will be used as recording sessions to record no more than 2 hymns for Sunday services. ***Anyone who would like to participate is welcome!*** This is not limited to choir members, includes all ages, family groups are great – get the generations together! We can use up to 6 participants per week, so reservations are a must! We will record in the fellowship hall which offers good ventilation, not to mention great acoustics. Don't be afraid to lend your voice. It will be like singing with a small congregation. *Give it a try, you may like it!*

In addition to pre-recorded hymns, we would like to enjoy one live song (solo for now with possible expansion as we gain experience). We are discussing ways to safely accomplish this. This song would most likely follow the sermon as Music for the Day.

Another opportunity is for all the instrumentalists in the congregation. No matter what instrument you play, get it out, dust it off, and let's find a place for it in worship. From time to time, we may play an instrumental setting of a hymn with words printed for the congregation to meditate on. *If your instrument is the piano or organ, we can plan for that too!*

Handbells is yet another possibility. I will be looking for pieces for small ensembles 3 to 6 players. More information to come on this, so stay tuned.


