New Life

Alleluia! Christ is risen!

Christ is risen indeed, alleluia!

What a wonderful celebration we had on the Resurrection of our Lord! I had been looking forward to celebrating this holy festival together! I am grateful for the ways each one of you showed up for our Holy Week commemoration of the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus the Christ! It is always the holiest of weeks.

The Season of Easter has begun and lasts 50 days. Scripturally, during this time, Jesus has been raised to resurrected life and is walking the earth, waiting to ascend to the Father. His wounds are still visible, but he is healed, whole, and full of new life. He makes appearances to his disciples, and we would expect, providing guidance to the disciples as they form the early Church. In his resurrection, Christ has birthed a new era!

For us, these 50 days are a time to enjoy the fruits sown in our Lenten labors. They are meant to cultivate new life, Christ-life, in us. What discipline did you pick up this year? How did it go?

One of my Lenten disciplines was rest, and another one was attunement. For me, attunement was listening for my physical, emotional, and spiritual needs and responding to them in a compassionate way. The second part of attunement was opening myself to opportunity and being a curious participant. Well, I learned that you can see a lot of life when you slow down!

Attunement may sound like an easy discipline, and perhaps for many of you, it would be! For me though, it can sometimes be a challenge. I can easily whiz by the roses without stopping to smell them! It is in those moments, however, that God may be doing something new!

I had the chance to see that during my sabbatical. I was visiting my Mom and one morning we went out to pick up some fresh eggs because she was planning to bake that day. She has some friends who operate a family farm. They sell fresh eggs, fresh vegetables, and goat's milk soap. We usually just quickly stop by to pick up eggs and chat for a minute. I usually wait in the car.

We went to their house and my Mom chatted a few minutes with the husband of the couple, Johnny. They talked for a few minutes and I sat in the car and saw that a big package was delivered to their door. In their conversation, I heard that he was waiting for something refrigerated. He could not see it nor could he hear a notification that it had arrived. I did not want him to miss his package so as my Mom was wrapping up, I opened my door, said hello, and told him a package had just been dropped off on the other side of the house.

He said, "Thank you, it's for my goats...Hey, would you like to see them? We have a four week old one. I need to feed her."

Now, normally, I would have said, "Well, thank you, but I need to get back, I have work to do." However, today, I had a clear schedule; and remembering my Lenten discipline of attunement, I said yes.

Johnny led my Mom and I through the gate to see the chicken coup (which included a chicken called "The King" for Elvis (how cool is that??); the reservoir, and the goat pen. They had several goats and one of them, a beautiful white one, locked eyes with me as we approached their gate. When we entered, we see her laying down. Johnny said, "That one is expecting. We found that the baby is breached so we have her scheduled for a C-section tomorrow."

Without much more, we walked on to see the baby goat. We walked to the stable and he held the little black baby goat in his arms and bottle fed her. She was a cutie! Another one of the goats was so affectionate and seemed to have the nature of a dog rather than a goat! She wanted to be petted and loved.

While we were feeding the baby goat and getting a layout of the land, Johnny stopped and walked over to the white goat we had passed earlier. He said with concern, "I think she's in labor." Of course, I couldn't even tell she was in labor, but Johnny did. He started working with her to try to turn the kid around.

"She is going to deliver. I have got to get this baby turned around."

My Mom and I stood by. We felt helpless. We stayed on the phone trying to get in touch with his wife the vet. No one answered. He was concerned for the lives of both mother and the baby.

He turned to us and asked, "Do you think you could take your rings off and help me turn this baby around?"

I was stunned, but I could see that this mother was in distress and pain. I said "I will do my best." Pushing myself beyond my fear and queasiness, I took off my rings, put on the gloves he gave me, I knelt down and followed Johnny's instructions.

We worked and worked to no avail. The hoof of the kid came out and we were scared for the mother. We continued to try to turn the baby, but to no avail. I was praying with all my might that we wouldn't lose this mother and baby.

And then, Johnny realized that what we thought was a back hoof, was actually a front hoof! Then came out its little nose and tongue. We still had hard delivery work to do, but this was a much better situation. Finally we got the little goat out and got it breathing.

Once it was breathing, I stood up and started to black out. I sat down on some nearby steps and then got up to walk a few paces away. I thought, "If I'm going to pass out, I've gotta find some clean grass!"

However, I held on to the fence and caught my breath. The second kidd came out quickly and safely. Mother and babies were fine!

Johnny thanked us for being there and for helping. We texted with them a little bit later and he and his wife said that they were taking special care of these new babies and had even named the one I helped deliver, "Adrienne", and the second one, "Debbie", after my Mom! We have gone back to visit them and have that special connection!

If I had just powered through my day, I would have missed out on that amazing experience. I had never birthed new life into the world. It is a beautiful and messy thing.

I invite you to consider the sprouts of new life growing in your life. God is always doing a new thing!

Items need for the kits are:


- One light-weight towel (20" x 40" to 52" X 27") dark colors recommended

Gene Biggerstaff called the meeting to order, Nena Babb had devotions.

Kathy Weaver read the minutes from the February meeting. Ray Whitener made a motion to accept the minutes as read, Jon Gladden seconded, and the motion passed.

Gene presented the treasurer's reports. The Building Fund as of February 28th had a balance of \$16,517.19, the Cemetery Fund \$1,159.83 and the General Fund \$3,644.58. Bryan Hood made a motion to accept the reports as presented, Kristin Teague seconded, and the motion was approved.

After some discussion Kathy made motion to accept the new recommendations by the Covid committee, Jon seconded, and the new recommendations were approved.

Security system: Ben Whitener presented the quote from Lake Hickory Security of \$4,739 for 24-48 hour recording, any backup equipment and monitoring would be an extra cost. The Tech Committee did not recommend and are still searching systems and companies.

Fellowship Hall-Youth rooms-Tables: Terry Bledsoe has picked up tables the unused tables and has begun work on the Pastor Displays.

Outdoor Worship Area: No updates at this time

Sound System: No major updates except the material cost has increased almost 3x what was originally estimated. They are also looking into a stand mic for the communion table.

Playground Equipment: The equipment had been ordered but there are extended delivery delays. The pavement will be replaced and the swings will be delivered sooner than the other equipment.

New Business

Lenten Offerings: Jon made a motion we send the offerings to Lutheran World Relief, which is currently helping in Ukraine. Nena seconded and the motion passed.

Council Retreat: It was decided to wait until Pastor Adrienne returns.

Safe Gatherings: April Fulbright said she has already completed the screening on-line and had no trouble. The fee has already been paid for the individuals that need to do the screening. April agreed to write up a procedure/policy for the church to have on record concerning the need for the screenings and who will need to participate.

Easter Breakfast: Ken Propst has suggested Norman's Café cater the meal with the church funding. A menu was provided to the church council with an estimated cost of \$8 per person. A suggestion of 100 - 125 plates be ordered with a donation box setup Easter morning. Jane will make a signup sheet for families to list the number of persons staying for breakfast. Norman's will deliver, setup and pickup after the meal. Sardis will provide drinks, plates, silverware and will serve the food. Norman's will need the order at least 2wks ahead of time.

With no other business to discuss Jon made a motion to adjourn the meeting. We ended with the Lord's Prayer.


