Joe called the meeting to order via Zoom at 7:05 pm with 11 council members in attendance. Jon had devotions.

Minutes from the August Council Meeting were read with no changes from the Council. Motion was made by Ken to accept the minutes, Rick seconded the motion and the motion carried.

The Treasurer's report was given by Joe, submitted by Dwayne Whitener, Finance Committee Chair. The General Fund balance was \$8,202.84 as of August 31, 2020; the Building Fund balance was \$4,910.45, the Cemetery Fund was \$1,437.69. Kathy made a motion to accept the Financial Report as read, Bruce seconded, motion carried.

Pastor Adrienne gave her monthly report included below:

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Another month passes! We are, day by day, making our way through this pandemic. We have kept in mind the mission to which God has called us and have continued our plans to the utmost of our ability. I continue to pray for everyone's wellness and safety. While the pandemic has put a halt to many things, it does not stop the passing of time or eliminate the needs of life. Work and school have resumed; surgeries are scheduled. Life goes on and it seems now like we are all waiting to see how Labor Day and the fall will affect COVID19 trends. It is still looking like it will be a long-term adjustment. Adaptation is so important in a time like this. While this is a desperate and heavy time, it is also a time to reflect on how we are church and how we might explore life-giving ways of being church together. I believe we have been creative and resourceful during this time.

Since our last council meeting, we have had the first of our commemorations of the Anniversary of Women's Ordination on August 16th. It was such a wonderful day! I felt so appreciated and I so deeply appreciate the privilege of serving at Sardis! On that Sunday, we also collected and blessed school supplies for Banoak and Blackburn Elementary Schools. Our Social Ministry Committee has been very active and responsive to community needs. As for our other commemorative services for the 50th Anniversary of the Ordination of Women, we will see about rescheduling our Sundays with Pastor Anna and Pastor Mary Louise once traveling is safe again.

We continue to have worship online as well as monthly drive-in services. I am so grateful to everybody who makes the services possible. I am appreciative of Nena who helped us continue from the beginning and hope we can publicly acknowledge her and thank her for her music ministry during the early days of the pandemic. I am grateful for Frank who comes each week and offers his support as needed. We do our best for worship planning given the restrictions and are planning to make a few changes for September.

In addition to worship planning and preparation, I respond to pastoral needs as best as I can. I am exploring using Zoom as a platform to help with pastoral requests and meetings. Two weeks ago, I hosted a social hour on Zoom to which six people attended. It was nice to connect for some casual conversation. I have also attempted to use Zoom for a virtual visit and a meeting for wedding planning. I will start to plan with Dena Propst Townsend and her partner Crystal this week. Their wedding will be on Friday, October 2 off-site.

I am also doing my best to stay up on continuing education. I finished the continuing education course "The Hidden Curriculum of White Supremacy" and have signed up for my next continuing education class called "Being Church in a Digital Age." I am also signed up for other webinars that will be offered as part of Fall Convocation (which was cancelled due to the pandemic). I'm about halfway there!

While there are so many discouraging trends happening in the world, I deeply believe the Holy Spirit is continuing to move and work in the world. We have continued to be in ministry and I am grateful for everyone's faithfulness during this time. I am delighted to say that I have been in conversation with Austin Propst about joining Sardis. I would like to bring this request before the council for approval.

Old Business

- Ken reported that everything that could be turned off to save power had been turned off. This is in an effort to save money.
- Joe had reported that the no touch soap and sanitizer dispensers were installed at the church. Since these were not to be installed until August, Joe his going to check if we will be charged for July. As a follow up, Joe reported that we would not be charged until we start using the church building again.

New Business

A discussion was held about the Sigmon Stringers Concert. The concert was approved earlier by the Council to be a drive in concert. Due to restrictions being loosened by the Governor, people are asking too sit in lawn chairs. Becky reported that if we do allow, it is limited to 50 people, masks and social distancing apply. Tim asked about the playground, it will be closed during the concert.

Jon made a motion to develop a pamphlet with rules and expectations to be given out as people entered. Carolyn seconded. Motion carried. Pamphlet info below:

Welcome to Sardis Lutheran Church, Sigman Stringers Concert!

In order to comply with State protocols for public gatherings we ask for your cooperation with the following guidelines during this event.

This is primarily a drive in concert. If you wish to view the concert from your vehicle proceed to your left and you will be directed to a parking space. If you wish to sit in the back of a truck this is considered as remaining in a vehicle, proceed to the left. Please remain in your car for the concert.

According to State Guidelines, we can allow up to 50 persons to set in chairs of their own provision. <u>Family units may sit together in the designated area in front of the cars</u> with groups distanced 6 ft. apart with a mask on. *However, we are limited to the first 50* paople. First same first same If you are sitting in chairs proceed to rear of the church and

people. First come, first serve. If you are sitting in chairs proceed to rear of the church and park your vehicle.

The playground is closed for this event. Please, for their safety and your fellow concert participants safety, please keep children <u>corralled.</u>

We hope you enjoy the concert, and thank you for following these guidelines...... Jesus said " Love your fellow concert goer as yourself!",Or something like that.

A Section of Martin Luther's Small Catechism

GRACE AT TABLE

Blessing before eating

When the children and the whole household gather at the table, they should reverently fold their hands and say:

"The eyes of all look to you, O Lord, and you give them their food in due season. You open wide your hand. You satisfy the desire of every living thing."

(It is to be observed that "satisfying the desire of every living thing" means that all creatures receive enough to eat to make them joyful and of good cheer. Greed and anxiety about food prevent such satisfaction.)

Then the Lord's Prayer should be said, and afterwards this prayer:

"Lord God, heavenly Father, bless us and these your gifts which of you bountiful goodness you have bestowed upon us, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen."

Thanksgiving after eating

After eating, likewise, they should fold their hands reverently and say:

"O give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; for his steadfast love endures forever. He gives to the beasts their food, and to the young ravens when they cry. His delight is not in the strength of the horse, nor his pleasure in the legs of a man; but the Lord takes pleasure in those who fear him, in those who hope in his steadfast love."

Then the Lord's Prayer should be said, and afterwards this prayer:

"We give you thanks, Lord God, our Father, for all your benefits, through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns forever. Amen."

About this testimony

Martin Luther's Small Catechism, 1529, was written to answer the need for a basic exposition of the Christian faith for lay people. It follows the historic form of a catechism, based on explanations of the Apostles' Creed, the Ten Commandments and the Lord's Prayer, to which Luther has added sections on Baptism, Confession and the Sacrament of the Altar, along with forms for Morning and Evening Prayer and Grace at Table.

Historically, a catechism was a short course in Christianity to prepare converts for Baptism. "Luther's Small Catechism is often seen as the beginning of catechesis in the modern sense," writes UCC church historian John B. Payne. "It had enormous influence on all subsequent catechisms, both Protestant and Catholic." It entered the UCC tradition as a faith testimony through one of our antecedent churches: the German Evangelical Synod of North America. Other historic creeds and confessions are collected in The Living Theological Heritage of the United Church of Christ, published by the Pilgrim Press and available from United Church Resources at 1-800-325-7061.


