Every call story is different. In case you are not familiar with this phrase "call story," it is a term indicating God's call, or mission, in your life, typically asked to someone serving in a ministry capacity. It is the all-pervasive inquiry you get again and again in seminary. One is propositioned, "Tell me about your call story" countless times. It is a formative question, encouraging you to try to articulate the somewhat inarticulable. You never know what you might hear in a call story; they are often quite intriguing. While we can't be sure of any predictable plot, we can mostly be sure that each person's call is going to be unique. God works in mysterious, curious, and often times amusing ways!

This question is asked of seminarians and candidates, however, it is a question for all of us, each of us respectively, as well as for us as a congregation, as the people of Sardis Evangelical Lutheran Church. In our mission statement, we articulate this to a degree. How did God lead us into this mission? Individually, we might ask of someone on Nellie B's: when did you get the sense of call to knit prayer shawls? We might ask of someone on the Altar Committee: how were you led to serve on this committee? To someone on the prayer group: what led you to pray for this person today?

We are all called to serve. Each of us has a unique and valuable way of doing that. Even if you may not be quite sure of your purpose or calling, you have one. We receive it in Holy Baptism, in addition to the grace-filled gifts of forgiveness of sins, salvation, and the Holy Spirit. It is a life covenant in which we live out a journey of discipleship that is expressed in our relationship with God, each other, and the world.

When we are baptized or affirm our baptism, we agree to "...live among God's faithful people; hear the word of God and share in the Lord's Supper; proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed; serve all people following the example of Jesus; and strive for justice and peace in all the earth."

Our baptism into Jesus Christ is fundamentally life-changing. We die to ourselves and are brought into the life and death of our risen Lord. Our identity changes, and we become a child of God, a brother, a sister, in Christ! When God looks upon us, God sees Christ! For almost a year, I have asked you to find out your baptismal birthdate. Thank you to everyone who has done this! My hope is to encourage us to discover how meaningful our baptismal identity is and how it affects the way we live. In worship, we are going to recognize baptismal birthdays. On the first Sunday of each month, we will invite folks with baptismal birthdays that month to be acknowledged with a song and prayer as an acknowledgement of this special birthday. I encourage you to wish them a Happy Baptismal Birthday too!

As we progress each year and celebrate "regular" birthdays, we reflect on our growth, the meaning of life, and who we want to become. It may help to stir reflection about God's activity in your life and how it makes a difference. Baptism is a one-time sacrament, however, we can grow in that gift as we strive and are led to grow in Christ's likeness. In our journey of growing in Christ's likeness, we may discover new insights and new expressions of our call along the way!




