September 2020

I have a sign on my wall that says:

"Life takes you to unexpected places Love brings you home"

I got this sign when I moved into my place here four years ago. I was relieved to be back in North Carolina. It felt good to be home. And this is a great sentiment after you have been out all day, or gone for many years, or returning for a visit or a reunion. But what about this year? Many of us have had *ALOT* of time at home lately and maybe we are ready for life to take us to unexpected places.

And life *IS* taking us to unexpected places. Our lives have been regulated and changed by COVID19. We never expected this to happen! Did we ever expect to be here? What does this mean for us on Homecoming Sunday on September 13?

We are both home, and we are in an unexpected place. What does that mean for Homecoming this year? I think about Exodus 14: 19-31, our first lesson for Homecoming Sunday. The Israelites have just escaped their enslavement in Egypt and were being led to a new land. They are early in their journey and the Egyptians are pursuing them every step along the way. However, God is leading the Israelites and protecting them in what seem like insurmountable circumstances. For example,

- The LORD put a pillar of cloud to protect the Israelite camp while they slept.
- When they were blocked by a great sea, the LORD moved the waters and made it dry land.
- When the Egyptians pursued them, the LORD clogged their chariot wheels.
- When the Egyptians saw the LORD was fighting for the Israelites, the Egyptians tried to turn around, but then the waters crashed and consumed them.

When the Israelites saw the great work of the LORD, they feared the LORD and believed in the LORD and his servant Moses.

The LORD was leading them to their new home. It didn't feel comfortable. It didn't feel safe. It wasn't what they expected. They walked through lots of unfamiliar territory. They didn't get there quickly. It took time. Imagine how many times they had to adapt! Imagine how they got through each day, having no idea when this long journey might end. They had ups and downs. Sometimes they needed encouragement; sometimes they provided encouragement to each other. It was hard. However, the LORD was leading them. Sometimes we are required to think about things differently and do things differently when the LORD is leading us. They did make it to the promised land.

Imagine the rejoicing, relief, and celebration when the Israelites reached the promised land. They had their own land and were no longer captive to Eygptian oppressors who used them for labor! They could live out their lives as the LORD's people, free and loved! From slavery to freedom, *LOVE* took them to unexpected places!

This biblical story may speak to how some of us are feeling. We can understand being in an unexpected situation. COVID19 is nothing like the passage the Israelites took, however, living in a pandemic has presented great challenges. So many lives have been lost. So many medical professionals have sacrificed so much. People have lost loved ones. People have lost their health. Economic disparities and injustice have been made clear. Many of us are tired of staying home and putting things on hold. This is a hard time.

I know there are times when each of us has been compelled by love to do something beyond ourselves, beyond our comfort levels, beyond our imagination. There are ways we have shown that Christ is our home in the way that we see and share Christ with others. That love grounds our interactions, spurs generosity, prompts our service. Love takes us where we don't expect to go!

Homecoming is something to celebrate! It may not feel the same. We won't get to have our picnic lunch, but it will be special! Our home is in Christ. No matter where we are, no matter how close or far we are to home, we have a home in our Lord Jesus Christ, and in Holy Baptism, Christ makes a home in us. We may be taken to uncomfortable places, new spaces, and different circumstances, but we can always come back to the promise of our Holy Baptism. We are claimed by God in the waters of baptism and brought into the life, death, and resurrection of Christ. Our home is forever made with Christ.

So maybe there is some truth beyond the wisdom of my wall sign. Love can also take us to unexpected places. I'm looking forward to seeing you on Saturday, September 12 for the Sigmon Stringers Concert and Sunday, September 13 at 8:30 AM for our Drive-in Homecoming Service!

Sardis Continues Social Ministry Outreach During COVID 19

The <u>SCHOOL SUPPLY DRIVE</u> on Sunday, August 16 was a great success! Thanks to all who donated items. You made a difference in the lives of the community's children and teachers. Many pencils, crayons, composition books, glue sticks, packs of notebook and copy paper, as well as bottles of hand sanitizer were collected. The school supplies were delivered to Banoak and Blackburn Elementary Schools on Monday, August 17. Both principals were very apprciative of all the donations. Since students cannot share glue sticks, crayons, pencils, etc. for fear of spreading the virus, the items will contribute to the safety of the students. *Once again, members of the Sardis congregation are ministering to the community.*

The next ministry focus of the Social Committee will be collecting and packaging <u>PERSONAL CARE KITS</u> during the September Drive in Service. As with the school supplies, just place the items in a bag in front of your car and the Social Committee will gather after the service. As in the past, these kits will be distributed to the homeless to help maintain their health. In 2020 Cleanliness may not be next to godliness, but it may help prevent the spread of germs and it certainly helps a person feel more human. The simple items included in a Personal Care Kit provide much-needed self-care, critical germs fighting and the chance to regain dignity from uncertainty.

Include the following items in each Personal Care Kit:

- One light-weight bath-size towel (20 in. x 40 in. to 52 in x 27 in)
- Two bath-size bars of soap, any brand, in original wrapping.
- One adult-size toothbrush in original packaging.
- One sturdy comb (no picks) or fine-toothed combs.
- One metal nail clippers, remove packaging.

All items must be new and in good condition.

Note: For those of you who do not have the opportunity to shop for the kits, members of the Social Committee will purchase them for you at \$7.00 per kit. The Social Committee will also be collecting these items in October.

The Social Ministry Committee will also be collecting <u>COATS FOR THE HOMELESS</u> during September, October, and November. Please bring the coats to church and put them on the table beside the food basket if we have in person service or in front of your cars if we continue the monthly drive in service. The coats must be in good condition. They should be for men, women, and children. In addition, the coats should be of all sizes. Thank you!

Finally, ECCCM needs your <u>EGG CARTONS</u>! Since many churches are not meeting in person, donations are way down. The staff of the ECCCM cannot distribute the eggs donated unless they have clean cartons to repackage the eggs. On occasion, the personnel were not able to repackage the eggs in a timely manner due to a shortage of donated egg cartons. Please either bring by the church or place in front of your car.

Thanks to all the congregation members who, in spite of not meeting in person, continue to work directly and indirectly with the many needs of our community during this difficult time. Whether it be Saturday Shut in Meals, online services and Sunday School, various collections or direct support to individuals, each recipient feels the caring and love of our church members. What a blessing to give!

Joe called the meeting to order via Zoom at 7:05 pm with 11 council members in attendance. Bruce had devotions.

Minutes from the May 12 Council Meeting, the called May 26 Council Meeting, and the called June 26 Council Meeting was distributed earlier to members to read and be ready to submit changes. No changes were made. Motion was made by Ken to accept the minutes as presented, Jon seconded the motion and the motion carried.

The Treasurer's report was given by Joe, submitted by Dwayne Whitener, Finance Committee Chair. The General Fund balance was \$19,285.60 as of June 30, 2020; the Building Fund balance was \$3,435.63; the Cemetery Fund was \$1,437.69. Pastor Adrienne gave her monthly report included below:

Grace and Peace to you! I hope you all are able to stay in and stay well in this time of pandemic. It is an unusual and difficult time in our country and world and I pray for God to lead us in acting faithfully. I believe that loving our neighbor faithfully means wearing our masks!

I am grateful for how we have thoughtfully and carefully worked together to continue being church during this time. We have made a lot of decisions that haven't been easy, but have so far have done our part to stymie the spread of the virus. I am grateful for everyone's leadership and commitment to our mission and ministry. Despite these restrictive circumstances, we have continued to have weekly worship and continue to engage in ministry to each other and the community. Our giving has been outstanding and I am so appreciative of the generosity of the congregation.

Since our last council meeting, I have continued to respond to pastoral needs and requests as best I can. During this time of social restriction, I reach out through phone calls and respond to requests to socially distanced appointments at the church. Even though our rhythms have been interrupted and our schedules changed, life goes on. Surgeries, illness, celebrations, challenges, and deaths continue to happen. Additional challenges and opportunities come with the stress and uncertainty of the time.

Our plans for celebrating the 50th Anniversary of the Ordination of Women have changed. Our original plans included Pastors Anna Merritt and Mary Louise and I to each have services crafted to this celebration. However, due to the pandemic and travel dangers and restrictions both Pastors Anna and Mary Louise feel that they need to hold off on coming as numbers have spiked in North Carolina and Catawba County. They were scheduled to come in September, however, we will postpone those plans and I will preach for Homecoming. We will however keep our plans to celebrate Women's Ordination on August 16th. Frank, Becky, and I will be working on this service and I am looking forward to it!



A Section of Martin Luther's Small Catechism THE SACRAMENT OF THE ALTAR

What is the Sacrament of the Altar?

Instituted by Jesus Christ himself, it is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ, under the bread and wine, given to us Christians to eat and to drink.

Where is this written?

The holy evangelists Matthew, Mark and Luke, and also St. Paul, write thus: "Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when he was betrayed, took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and gave it to the disciples and said, 'Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.' In the same way also he took the cup, after supper, and when he had given thanks he gave it to them, saying, 'Drink of it, all of you. This cup is the new covenant in my blood, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

What is the benefit of such eating and drinking?

We are told in the words "for you" and "for the forgiveness of sins." By these words the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation are given to us in the sacrament, for where there is forgiveness of sins, there are also life and salvation.

How can bodily eating and drinking produce such great effects?

The eating and drinking do not in themselves produce them, but the words "for you" and "for the forgiveness of sins." These words, when accompanied by the bodily eating and drinking, are the chief thing in the sacrament, and he who believes these words has what they say and declare: the forgiveness of sins.

Who, then, receives this sacrament worthily?

Fasting and bodily preparation are a good external discipline, but he is truly worthy and well prepared who believes these words: "for you" and "for the forgiveness of sins." On the other hand, he who does not believe these words, or doubts them, is unworthy and unprepared, for the words "for you" require truly believing hearts.
