He and his wife, Rita, have been married for 39 years. They met at Sardis and, as is said, "they were destined to be together", although it took Rick a few years to pop the question.

Ricky Dale Lutz is a cradle Lutheran at Sardis. His dad was a member of Ebenezer Methodist and his mother was Lutheran. Fortunately, for all of us, Rick's dad agreed to attend Sardis and Rick grew up here,

attend Sardis and Rick grew up here, participating in many activities over all these years. Rick worked as an electrician. He worked for a long time at Industrial Electric. Then moved to what he thought was greener pastures at Superior Cable for one year. He missed his boss so much at Industrial Electric he returned there to work. After many years, he found a home in the Catawba County School System in maintenance. He loved working



at the different schools and meeting all the fabulous children. He always kept an eye out for children he knew from church. Rick was diagnosed with kidney disease. This is a serious situation as Rick now is on dialysis, after having multiple surgeries to remove tumors and tissue from both kidneys. He will have additional scans in December.

Rick has many stories of his life at Sardis, most of them connected with his willingness to fix electrical problems, suggest different ways of doing things, and being on the property committee.

Pastor Anna and Barbara Whitener called Rick one day when they found a mouse captured in a trap they set. "What do we do?" they wanted to know. Rick came to the rescue. Another time, there was a problem with the air conditioner in the education wing. It was decided that Rick Johnson was the skinniest man there so Rick crawled up in the attic, and ended up falling through the ceiling. Fortunately, he was not hurt.

All these years, when Rick was healthy, he was always in the middle of solutions and ideas for the equipment. Often his cohorts have been Ken Propst and Roger Teague. Even though Rick mostly gives advice now, he continues to ride by the church and check the outside lights, which he is suggesting may be changed to LED lights in the future because they will last longer.

In his lifetime, Rick has been an avid hunter, using coon dogs and hounds. There are two deer heads mounted in his living room and he has a shed filled with other ones. He says his favorite sound is "hearing a hound treeing a coon."

Rick hopes the property behind the church might be developed with a walking track and an activity building that may be used as a center of being together. Rick has good feelings about where Sardis is today and where Sardis is heading. He misses being able to participate like he has done in years past but he certainly keeps up with the people and the activities that make Sardis a special place to be.



Prof. Emeritus, the Rev. Dr. Paul Weber and retired Assoc. Prof. Florence Jowers—no strangers to the LR community—will lead a "Hymn Sing" Workshop on Saturday, September 30, 10:00-11:30 am in the Choral Room of the Mauney Music Building. The workshop is designed for students, lay people, parish and area musicians, clergy, and all who love to sing hymns. Dr. Weber will introduce songs from his expansive new hymn collection, *So Great a Cloud of Witnesses*. Participants will enjoy hearing the background of the hymns before singing them and will affirm the importance of community song for faith and life. Dr. Weber's original music beautifully portrays his own texts and those of prominent hymn writers such as Brian Wren, Carl Daw, Gracia Grindal, and Jaroslav Vajda.

Weber is a pastor of the North Carolina Synod (ELCA) with twenty years of parish experience. He is also Prof. Emeritus of Church Music at Lenoir-Rhyne University and past conductor of the Lenoir-Rhyne University A Cappella Choir. Accompanist for the Hymn Sing will be Florence Jowers, a deacon of the Virginia Synod (ELCA) who served as Lenoir-Rhyne University Organist and Conductor of the Lenoir-Rhyne Youth Chorus for many years. During the 2022-2023 academic year Dr. Weber and Prof. Jowers were Visiting Professors of Church Music in the School of Theology at The University of the South in Sewanee, TN. Married for forty-five years, they have retired to Staunton, VA, and travel often to visit their three children and six grandchildren.

### Sardis Lutheran Church Council Minutes July 9, 2023

Members present: Mary Louise, Kristin, Susan, Roger, Dwayne, Terry, Ken, Mike, April, Nena, Ray, Gene

Terry Bledsoe called the meeting to order at 5:00, Ken had devotion.

The minutes from the June meeting were discussed.

Corrections needed:

- Add Gene to June meeting as being present
- Correct spelling of Rev Ce Cee name, listed as Rev Cee Cee, needs to be Rev Ce Cee

Ken made a motion to approve the minutes, with the corrections that need to be made, Gene seconded, and the motion was carried.

Dwayne presented the treasurer's report from June. The Building Fund, Cemetery Fund, and General Fund numbers were not discussed because statements were not in prior to Jane's knee surgery. Activity Statement was provided. So far in July we are at a break-even month, possibly \$2000 ahead based on last two Sunday's offerings. We are slightly ahead with funds over expenses YTD. Benevolence money we owed due to not paying taxes prior to change in secretary has been completed. Ray questioned the line item on the Statement of Activity that states "unpaid PR taxes penalties and interest". Dwayne reports in 2018 IRS had no record of one of the church's payments and he had no documentation either so church paid out \$2692.39 to cover this error. Dwayne now has all confirmation numbers of money paid out. Late penalty was approximately \$1300. Over \$30,000 was paid toward benevolence which includes the years taxes were not paid and the penalties. After discussion was completed, Nena made a motion to accept the financial report, Mike seconded, motion carried.

Dwayne mentioned we got \$800.00 back for sales tax from purchases made using the church credit card to buy supplies. Dwayne requested that members use the card to purchase items for church functions so we can be reimbursed the sales tax. Dwayne states if a member turns in a bill for reimbursement, we do not get a refund of the sales tax.

- Attended FT Foard seniors luncheon and provided prayers
- Attended funeral for Faye Midgett
- Attended funeral for Rheda Teague
- Not included in today's report, but she made 2 facility visits and 1 home visit today
- Tomorrow she is going to Atrium Cabarrus to visit Donald Fulbright

I used \$268.35 from the Discretionary Fund.

Ray wants the committee to know the seriousness of this task. Terry will speak with the members about requirements.
- Congregational Study Committee: Jill Bledsoe, Donna Biggerstaff, Dawn Covington non-council members. Council members that agreed to assist include Mike Midgett, Susan Jones, Nena Babb, Ray Whitener, and Jane Moretz. Pastor Mary Louise mentioned a new software program about demographics which would be free for us but she is uncertain the name of the software. July 23<sup>rd</sup> is the first part of the study which will require extensive note taking.
- Congregational Meeting: buying slaw from Mt. View BBQ, sign-up sheet for what members are bringing was reviewed and updated. Ben Whitener will prepare the BBQ. Ken bringing lemonade. Nena will check with Barbara Whitener regarding supplies like plates, napkins, etc. Council will be the ones to serve the meal.

### New Business:

- Homecoming 2023 is September 10<sup>th</sup>. Nena will have full report net meeting. Looking to invite back confirmation classes to speak. Meal will be covered dish.
- Power update given by Terry: one leg of power was affected by storms in which Duke Power resolved. This past week, Jane had copier issues and had to call the copier contact who states router was the problem. Terry stated everything worked for 30 minutes. Had to purchase a refurbished router so copier is currently working. Everything seemed fine until this morning, when sound system wouldn't work, 3 air units upstairs not working. Multiple things damaged by storms which will take some time to get all sorted out with routers, ports, wires. So far, \$130 has been paid for repairs made.
- August Evangelism event Ray inquired about postponing event since all these other meetings require the congregation to participate in and last year's event was not well attended. It was mentioned about combining with fall festival but April reports no

festival is currently planned for this year. Ray then decided to cancel the August event.

- Susan made a request to use the church once a month for her community senior group that she is a part of to make cards. Not sure of date when it would start but Susan wants to invite the members of Sardis to also attend. Card making session is approximately 2 hours in duration. Ray made a motion to allow Susan to use the church for her senior group, Ken seconded, motion accepted.
- Air conditioning is being handled differently than before to keep church at more of a standard temperature which will prevent the units from having to work so hard to cool the church.
- Kristin brought up question about security and what needs to be done if someone approaches the door that you do not know after church has started. Ask person to leave and if something looks suspicious call police, don't let them in. Nena brought up that our security team are volunteers and getting them some training on things to look for may be beneficial. Terry will contact sheriff's department to see about setting up a training for the security team.
- Blessing Box: Council's week to monitor and refill the box
- Caulking in the back where dampness is occurring will need to be done by someone else since Donald is unavailable due to being in the hospital

Next Council Meeting is August 20<sup>th</sup> at 5:00 pm.
