Compost your pain. "Suffering denied is suffering unhealed." Don't bury or deny your pain. Talking about it makes your life flower and as it ages it turns to fertilizer (helping others grow and grieve.)

Open nature's mail. There are over 400,000 species of flowering plants—God adores variety. 100 trillion neural connections go on in the human brain. Nature's messages are from God.

HOMECOMING 2024 SPEAKER

We welcome back the Reverend Denise Henry to speak at our Homecoming Service on Sunday, September 8th.

Rev. Denise was raised in SC and has been in NC since 1986 when she and her former husband, Rev. James White, was called to ministry at Sardis until 1990. She attended Columbia College for her bachelor's degree and received her Master's in Counselor Education from Lenoir Rhyne University and an Advanced Certificate in School Counseling from UNC-Greensboro. She served as a school counselor for 23 years, retiring in 2018.

Through the encouragement of the NC Women of the ELCA, as she served on the Board, she discerned the call to ordained ministry. She entered Luther Seminary in 2016 and graduated in 2021 with her Master's in Divinity. During her internship year at Mt Olive, Hickory, she discerned her calling to chaplaincy and applied to Atrium Health Wake Forest's chaplain residency program. She served as a Chaplain resident, graduating in 2022. During that time, she served as a part time interim at Christ Lutheran in Jonesville.

Rev. Denise serves as Chaplain for Lutheran Services Carolinas - Forsyth Campuses, specifically Trinity Elms Senior Care Community in Clemmons and Trinity Glen Senior Care Community in Winston-Salem. She has been there since January 2023 and was ordained on February 11, 2023.
