



#### **Thanksgiving Eve Service**




Today we will celebrate our youth who **are confirming their faith** at a reception in their honor. Be sure to stop by for cake and punch and congratulate the confirmands.

#### Council Minutes Sardis Lutheran Church September 14, 2025

Members present: Darrell Jarrett, Dwayne Whitener, Gene Biggerstaff, Jane Moretz, Joe Biggerstaff, Jon Gladden, Ken Propst, Rick Johnson, Zachary Stuart, Tim Whitener, Mike Midgett, Pastor Oscar Shephard

- Joe called the meeting to order at 7pm with 11 council members and the Pastor present.
- Mike provided devotions which focused on listening closely to God's word and to speak out and take action for justice.
- No additions or corrections to the minutes from the August 10<sup>th</sup> council meeting were brought forward and Dwayne made a motion that the minutes be approved as written. Ken seconded the motion and the council approved unanimously.
- The Financial reports ending August 31st were reviewed. Dwayne noted nothing of concern for the past month. He stated that \$5300.00 from the building fund account has been used year -to-date to help with paying basic costs and there has been an increase in offerings over the past month. Four months of Benevolence have been paid year-to-date with two more months to be paid by the end of September. With no further discussion, Ken made a motion to accept the financial reports as presented and this was seconded by Rick. The motion was approved.

#### Pastor's Report:

Pastor Oscar provided a detailed ministry overview of his activities in August which highlighted:

- The Confirmands are on track and have been very engaged. Confirmation is planned to take place on Reformation Sunday.
- The costs to attend Lutheridge continue to increase and he has encouraged the youth confirmands to attend TEC instead.
- Visitations are going well. He had a nice visit with Monte Speagle.
- He has seen and up-tick on unplanned visits over the past month.
- The Blessings Box program continues to go well which now include books and bibles.
- He served with his son Gabriel at the latest TEC gathering.
- First communion for the younger youth will begin soon.

#### **Old Business:**

- Committee funding requests:
- All committees needing funding for 2026 need to submit these requests to Dwayne asap. The Finance committee will begin meeting soon to prepare the budget for 2026. The final budget recommendation will be presented to the church council in October and to the congregation in November. Jane and Dwayne will work to finalize these dates.
- Property Committee updates/actions:
- ♦ Doors leading into the Narthex (Mike and Terry will begin refinishing these soon)
- Metal stairs in back of the Church (The property committee will schedule a work session later this year to repaint these once the weather cools down)
- The Beard growing contest (Wise men/Shepherds/Moses) continues until the end of November. All men are encouraged to take part in this contest/fundraiser.

#### **New Business:**

- The council discussed taking part in an available program from the Synod called **Church Communications Cohort**. This program is designed to help churches improve internal and external communication as well as fostering connections within your congregation and community. The seven-week program lasts from late September until early November. After discussion, the council decided not to take part in this program.
- Land Use committee update:
- ♦ Fire Pit/Eagle Scout project update (Josh Alling): This project has been approved by the Eagle Scout board.
- After discussion concerning the property behind the church, the decision was made to continue to let Tracy farm a portion of the land. Rick will speak to Tracy about this and this matter will again be reviewed next spring.
- A motion was brought forward by Jane with a second from Rick that we return to collecting offerings by "passing the plate". Collecting offerings in a single offering plate in the Narthex was a temporary measure implemented due to the Covid crisis. After discussion, the motion was approved and this process will begin asap.

The October meeting of the Church Council will be held on Sunday, October 12<sup>th</sup> at 7pm.

The Council contact with devotions for October will be Darrell Jarrett.

With no other items to discuss, Joe made a motion that the meeting be adjourned, and Ken seconded the motion.

The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.
